Betty has recently moved to Wisconsin to be near family, but many of us still remember the hard work & effort she put into making the Flying Needles Quilt Guild as successful as it is today! She has been a member since 1991, which was actually since the very beginning. She had been a dressmaker for 35 years, then retired and decided to sew what she loved -- quilts, angels, dolls & baby quilts for hospitals, and more. She was active in the guild for many years.

- -- During her first 5 years, she was <u>on the Board</u> -- Secretary for 2 years, Raffle Chairman another year, then the President and Vice President for a year each.
- -- She held numerous workshops -- "Tea with Angels" was very popular
- -- She <u>started the BEGs Club</u> (short for Beginners), teaching newbies how to make quilt blocks, and lots of basic techniques in the quilting process over the span of a year, ending up with each student completing a sampler quilt. Her group was so popular that her students wanted to sign up for another year, even though the next year's group was full.
- -- She helped organize Opportunity Quilts
- -- Betty organized fabrics for charity quilts
- -- And she was even a <u>Program Speaker</u> a couple times -- once for the topic of Copyright Laws, and another called "The Anatomy of a Quilt".
- -- On a personal note, Betty has won several ribbons for her quilts in quilt shows

Betty has been an Honorary Member since 2017.

I shared this information at the April 2022 meeting, and before I could sit down, members recounted several other stories about how Betty helped them!.....







We have had a lot of newcomers join our guild, and one of the things they learn is that when one of our members is going through tough times, we make a quilt for them. Instead of asking members to turn in blocks on quick notice to make a quilt, we have chosen to have members turn in blocks whenever they can, and when a quilt is needed, the blocks are all ready to assemble. Each block has the person's name on it who made the block. (Patterns for the cancer block and friendship block are on our website).


