

Piecing With Curves and Circles

I love seeing circles in quilting but have never been happy with my results using various methods of applique. Then I discovered a tutorial for inseting circles. I am a convert and will probably never applique circles again.

In this class we will explore different methods of incorporating circles into a quilt: raw edge applique, needle turn applique and inset circles. You can decide which is your favorite. But I would ask that you really give inset circles a try.

We will look at inseting circles on plain squares, premade blocks and half-square triangles. You can place these circles on anything. Once you get the hang of inseting circles and sewing curves, you just might be hooked!

Supplies

- Sewing Machine in Good Working Order
- Standard sewing supplies (thread, needles, scissors, etc.)
- Rotary cutter with sharp blade
- Small sharp pointed scissors
- Straight ruler/square
- Erasable fabric marker
- Washable glue stick (Elmers. SewLine)
- Zipper foot (this is optional but will be useful for sewing your curves)
- Multiple pieces of background and contrasting fabrics at least 10" square. Each block requires 1 piece of each fabric
- Various circular items used to trace on your fabric
- I will provide freezer paper and steam a seam
