Materials Needed:

- 5 (2 ½") squares in assorted green fabrics
- 5 (2 ½") squares in assorted blue fabrics
- 4 (2 ½") squares in assorted purple fabrics
- 5 (2 ½") squares in assorted red fabrics
- 5 (2 ½") squares in assorted yellow fabrics
- 1 (2 ½") black square for the free spot
- **If selecting fabric with a friend, do not use the same exact fabrics or you will have the same exact bingo card. The same applies if you make two cards; use different fabrics on each card.

IMPORTANT

Make sure you have 5 DIFFERENT FABRIC CATEGORIES represented within EACH color column. For example, you should not have two fabrics with dots in the blue column, but you can have fabric with dots in the blue and red columns. Try for a good assortment!!



Directions:

- *Please use an accurate ¼ inch seam. Press well.
- *Join 5 green squares to make a column.
- *Join 5 blue squares to make a column
- *Join 4 purple squares, with a black square in the middle for the free space, to make a column
- *Join 5 red squares to make a column
- *Join 5 yellow squares to make a column Be aware of pressing seams in the opposite direction for each color column so the they will butt together nicely when sewn together.
- *Sew all columns together, colors in the order of the photo above.
- *Last, sew and $1/8^{th}$ inch seam around the outside of your block. It should measure 10 % inches.
