



We had a great turnout for the July Community Workshop. The ladies made 115 stocking kits, 25 pillowcase kits, and 60 backpack kits. We were very productive while enjoying some awesome fellowship and food.

All of this productivity has resulted in a need for additional Christmas and lining fabric. If you have some not in use, we would very much appreciate the donation.

To date, we have completed 791 stockings, 57 quilts, 122 pillowcases, and 71 backpacks, for a total of 1,041 items completely finished! In addition, we have 42 small quilt tops ready to quilt and bind -- that's a total of 1,083 items. WOW!

Last but not least, remember, you can receive a strip of 4 door prize tickets for each 5-item stocking/pillowcase/backpack kit turned in at the General Meeting. For those who turned in items prior to the General Meeting, just see me or Deborah and we will let Polly or Deb know your items were previously received.

a Jrip Down Memory Lane: Deb Chilcote, FN29 Historian

This is the 8th installment of a new series that focuses on what happened during the <u>current</u> month, and I will share tidbits of interesting information for that particular month over several years to give you a glimpse of what we did as a group.

AUGUST

<u>1996</u> – <u>Doris Olig</u> proudly announced that her "Storm at Sea" wallhanging was the 3rd Place winner in a magazine quilt contest, and will be featured in the magazine in November!

1998 -- The program for August was a Flea Market, with a chance to sell/swap/barter any items

– Our <u>Flying Needles Quilt Guild banner</u> was made at a workshop this month in 1998. The original purpose of the banner was to be used during quilt raffle group sale functions, future craft show involvement, and any activity at which we wanted to ensure that the guild was recognized.

This picture shows the banner; it was taken at the Registration table at our <u>2018 Quilt Retreat at Camp Timpoochee</u> – Kaye Joachim, the late Chris Maher, Barbi Ouellette, and behind them is Ginger Maddox.

(In 2023, member <u>Ruthie Reynoso made some additional</u> <u>banners</u> with a fresh look for retreats and shows.



2004 – Our Treasury balance was almost \$10,000 (in 2023, we are in the mid- to high-\$20,000's).

<u>2006</u> – <u>Jean Towery</u> taught a workshop called "Stained Glass Christmas Table Runner," and the Program was Mary Molinari talking about hand-dyed fabrics.

2008 – The guild is starting to get copies of the <u>Country Register</u>, a bi-monthly newspaper that advertises all about quilt shops in Florida, and any news in the state that's related to quilting, crafting, antiques, and more.

2009 – The Board decided to reduce the annual dues to \$20 (it was raised the previous year because if we didn't do any raffle quilts, the extra \$5 per member would make up the difference). The annual dues at the current time is at \$25/year again, and we have frequently been making Opportunity Quilts.

2015 – We moved our meetings from the Niceville Church of Christ to our current place, the New Hope Baptist Church in Valparaiso, where they allow us to meet 4 times/month. This also gives us a larger storage room of 12' x 18', all for \$200/month.

-- A new quilt shop opened in Crestview, "A Quilter's Place" (in 2023, they announced they are closing their doors).

FN29 Board Meeting Minutes—June 6, 2023: Diane Roberson

Members Present: Kerry Kastl, Anne Johnson, Konnie Glaze, Diane Roberson, Penny Maus, Kaye Joachim, Marisol Kingsbury, Deborah Moan

Meeting called to order by Kerry at 09:02 AM

Agenda:

Kerry discussed the need to acknowledge the generous donation of a complete quilt kit, Boho Hearts valued at \$431.40 by Bunny Wilson from New Hope Baptist Church. This kit will be used for the 2025 Opportunity Quilt. The cost she paid was \$34.95/month plus approximately \$6.00/month shipping for 12 months. The current value of the product is \$29.95/month for 15 months plus approx. \$6.00 monthly shipping that now includes the backing not included in the 2022 BOM. Kerry suggested a monetary donation to the church food pantry of \$500 with \$250 coming from the Opportunity Quilt budget and \$250 from the general funds. This was discussed by all present. A **motion** was made by Anne and **seconded** by Konnie to donate \$500. A verbal vote approved the motion by the board members present, however the board felt the matter should be brought to the membership at the next general meeting for decision prior to action. Deborah, Diane and Kerry recently attended a meeting with New Hope leaders and other organizations that also use the Fellowship Hall. They shared some of the efforts the church is making to support community members in need.

Opportunity Quilt 2025: Diane volunteered to coordinate the construction and marketing of the 2025 Opportunity Quilt, Boho Hearts.

Treasurer Report: Cherie Matheson provided a report by phone. The current bank balance is \$26,874.20.

Quilts of Valor: The guild has a QOV hanging in the Fort Walton Beach Library currently. Valeria Holmes, Public Relations is coordinating with library staff.

Retreat 2024: Kaye announced that she was able to decrease the registration fee for guild members from \$20 to \$15 for the retreat. The Sewing and Training Center will be the vendor for the retreat after Oh Sew Pretty needed to cancel. Plans are underway to open registration prior to the August general meeting for members and open to others and post on the FNQG website by October 1.

Nominating Committee for 2024 Board Members: Diane will chair the Nominating Committee with Karen Garland and Kathy Crews making up the team. They have a goal of contacting 100% of membership to ensure all have the opportunity to volunteer to be on the ballot for an elected position in 2024. Efforts to contact are underway.

Membership: Penny presented the names of 4 members to be considered for honorary membership. They were early members after the guild was founded. They are: Pat Walker, Grace Grimsley, Jonie Haught, & Betty Davey. **Motion** made by Konnie to approve honorary membership and **seconded** by Diane; voice vote approved.

Fund Raising: Marisol announced that she has registered for 2 tables at the Niceville Bazaar to be held on October 21^{st} from 10 am -4 pm. A sign-up sheet will be available to fill the needed positions for set-up,

sales, and take-down. The 5th Thursday in August is scheduled to be devoted to making boutique sales items. More information will be coming related to suggested patterns/items needed.

Mystery Shopping Trip: Konnie plans to do a dry run of the route and plans are underway for a fun day of shopping and travel.

July Program: Billece Morrison will do a Trunk Show and be joined by 2 award winning quilters sharing quilts displayed at major quilt shows. Deborah volunteered to assist with the set-up to hang and display quilts.

Quilt Display Hanging Rack: Kerry discussed the need to replace the two hanging racks currently in use. It was agreed that they do not function well. Anne **motioned** that we purchase new heavy duty quilt display hanging racks. **Seconded** by Konnie; verbal vote approved the motion.

Election of Board Members: The Nominating Committee will be responsible for the election procedure in September. Members present discussed the need to ensure the procedure runs smoothly and all votes where a candidate is clearly indicated are counted. Kerry provided Diane with reference materials to assist in planning for the election with a simple majority vote winner.

Adjourn: Konnie motioned to adjourn, seconded by Anne. Adjourned at 9:52 AM.

FNQG General Meeting

13 July 2023

Meeting called to order at 10:00 am by Kerry Kastl.

Prayer, pledge of allegiance, and singing of God Bless America was lead by Linda Weiss.

Sunshine-n-Shadows: Nancy Kramer sent two cards in the preceding month. Nancy and Kerry both had close family members pass recently.

Membership: Penny Maus reports we have 61 members present and 9 visitors including Carolyn Slack, Linda Taliaferro, Winnie Fonderer (friends of Billece Morrison), Kevin & Monique Holland (friends of Cheri Perry), Nancy Huntington (daughter of Betty Davis), Liam Kingsbury (grandson of Marisol Kingsbury), Ellen Elam (sister of Anne Johnson), and Wanda Walker (friend of Diane Roberson). There are no new members today.

Nominating Committee: Diane Roberson, Chair and members Karen Garland and Kathy Crews comprise the Nominating Committee for 2024 guild election. They will attempt to contact all members to identify members interested in running for office. A slate of officers will be presented at the August General Meeting and nominations may be submitted from the floor. An Absentee Ballot will be included in Needle Notes in September for those unable to attend the September Annual Meeting. The procedure for

submitting an Absentee Ballot will be followed by the SOPP found on the FNQG website. Instructions will be included in Needle Notes. The election will be held at the September Annual Meeting.

2025 Opportunity Quilt: Diane Roberson reports that Boho Heart, a BOM pattern will be used to make the 2025 Opportunity Quilt. The pattern and kit with all quilt top fabrics and binding was donated by Bunny Wilson from New Hope Baptist Church. There are 12 kits with 7 to 16 blocks in each that are being distributed to guild members. Kits are to be completed by September 14 then construction of the heart and background will begin. There will be an opportunity for many members to contribute to the construction and marketing of this quilt. Discussion was held regarding the value of quilt kit and the needs of New Hope that we might contribute towards. Kerry explained that the Board discussed and approved giving the Food Pantry of New Hope Baptist Church a gift of \$500.00 (\$250 from the Opportunity Quilt budget and \$250 from general funds). A **motion** was made by Linda Hudson to donate \$500, Cindy Vines **seconded** the motion. A unanimous verbal vote approved the decision.

Treasurer Report: Anne Johnson provided a finance report submitted by Cheri Matheson. The current balance is \$27,009.42.

Hospitality: Mary Ann Sharp thanked everyone that brought refreshments and door prizes today.

Retreat 2024: Kaye Joachim reports plans are going smoothly for the February 2024 Retreat at Timpoochie. Registration for guild members will be emailed 2 days before the August General Meeting. Registration will be open to non-guild members on October 1st with registration posted on the FNQG website and Facebook. Registration is \$15/day.

Community Service: Sherry Hayes reports that lots of quilt tops have been turned in and are available for quilting/binding.

Newsletter: Peggy Murrell reports that the deadline for submitting information for the next newsletter is July 20th.

Minutes: Kerry Kastl verified that all members present received this month's edition of Needle Notes with the minutes included. There were no corrections to the minutes. Deborah Moen **motioned** that the minutes be approved. Sherry Kruschke **seconded** the motion; verbal vote approved.

Program: Billece Morrison and friends Carolyn Slack, Linda Taliaferro and Winnie Fonderer provided a trunk show of quilts, many won ribbons at various quilt shows. They shared stories about their quilts as well as interesting events that happened over the years of attending quilt shows and retreats together. Pictures will be on the FNQG Facebook Page and in Needle Notes.

Future Programs: Anne Johnson announced that the Ugly Fabric Blocks are due next month. On September 16th, a Saturday, the guild will hold a jelly roll sewing event led by LaLani James in recognition of Jelly Roll Month. There will be a potluck, fun, and door prizes available.

Workshops: Konnie Glaze announced the upcoming scheduled workshops to include: Rope Bowls in July, Any Witch Way wall hanging in August, the Mystery Trip in September, and Joy – Needle Turn Applique in October.

Strip Club: Angel Schauer coordinated the drawing of an orange strip. Zee Gibson was the winner and she chose purple for next month.

Birthdays: July Birthdays were celebrated. Sherry Kruschke was the winner of the drawing.



Ruth Johnson made a Grinch quilt, and a baby quilt.






Jayne Pendergast finished another crocheted character in her Nativity series -- Mary & baby Jesus

in some of the blocks.


