# October 1, 2020 Board Meeting

Pam Cortner called the meeting to order at 9:00 am.

**Attendance**: Pam Cortner, Penny Maus, Shrilee Carter, Sharon Jacobs, Kaye Joachim, Theresa Atkinson, Linda Weiss, Konnie Glaze, Liz Barnes, Anne Johnson, Polly Shields, and Jo Peppey.

**New Board Members**: Pam reviewed each board position and where everything stands moving on toward the new board taking office.

- -Jo Peppey and Deborah Moen are working together through December. There will be no December program due to the potluck and 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary recognition for the Flying Needles Quilt Guild. The anniversary will be advertised in The Bay Beacon and other free advertisements. There will be a banner and Pam hopes to have a group photo taken.
- -Liz Barnes is working on the workshop for January. There will be no workshop in February due to the quilt show. Liz is following up with people to schedule workshops.
- -Theresa Atkinson will be Konnie Glaze's back up if Konnie is unable to attend meetings. Theresa will take over at the January board meeting.
- -Anne Johnson will take over as treasurer in January.
- -The new board will go to the bank after the January board meeting to change over the signatures on the bank account and to file their names with the state.

**Treasurer**: Pam gave the finance report. The September income was \$1,152.00, expenses \$702.74, and the bank account balance as of August 31 was \$24,051.28.

**Dues**: Penny has concerns regarding the amount of traffic that builds up by the registration desk to pay dues. The signin table will be in the usual place, and names will be recorded as people enter. Dues payment will be on the other side of the room. Door prize tickets will also be sold on the other side of the room. This is to ensure safe distancing. Door prizes ticket sales will remain on the other side of the room permanently.

**October Meeting**: The podium will remain in the same place with the addition of a long table beside it. Pam would like the board to sit at the long table. For October, Liz, Jo, Konnie and Marisol will sit there. Clipboards for workshops and hospitality will be available at this table.

**Quilt Show**: Konnie is looking for a person to be responsible for the QOV Block Party. Jo Peppey will think about it. Linda Weiss shared that there are ten quilts entered so far. Pam inquired about having the QOV Block Party next to the QOV Fundraiser Quilt.

#### **Announcements:**

Sharon Jacobs indicated there was a discrepancy with the numbers reported and recorded in the meeting minutes for the officer elections held at the September Annual Meeting. Sharon will make a motion to amend the minutes with the correct numbers at the October meeting.

### October 8, 2020 General Meeting Minutes

- 1. The meeting was called to order by Pam Cortner at 10:00 a.m.
- 2. Linda Weiss led the prayer and Pledge of Allegiance.
- 3. Polly, working the sign-in table, informed the members that there were 35 members present, 1 new member, and 3 guests. The guest speaker, Lu Ann Joswick, Shannon Whipkins, and Teresa Arrington were guests and Margaret Jacobs is our new member.
- 4. Penny reminded us that if your dues are not paid by the December general meeting (December 10) you will not be included in the 2021 Directory.
- 5. Pam asked if everyone was getting the newsletter. It appears that everyone is receiving the email with the Needle Notes attachment. Yah!
- 6. There was a correction to the September annual meeting minutes: 42 members voted in person and 14 absentee ballots were counted for a total of 56. Pam explained the reason the number differs from how many are in attendance is that she has to make a note of EVERYONE who comes into the building for tracking purposes during this COVID ordeal and not everyone stayed for the meetings.
- 7. A motion was made by Penny Maus and second by Linda Weiss to approve the corrected September annual meeting minutes. The minutes were approved as written. A motion was made by Grace Grimsley and second by Zandra Gibson to approve the September general meeting minutes. The minutes were approved as written.
- 8. Items for the November newsletter are due to Jayne Pendergast by October 15, 2020. Please be sure to send pictures of what you are working on if you did not bring them to the October meeting's show n tell.
- 9. Marisol Kingsbury gave the treasurer's report. We have a balance as of September 30, 2020 of \$24,051.28.
- 10. Lu Ann Joswick was our guest speaker. She talked about an organization she is involved with called The Secret Place. Lu Ann is starting a life-skills sewing class to teach young girls how to sew and progress from hand sewing to machine sewing. They come once per week for 1-1/2 hours. Pam is going to introduce LuAnn to Ruthie Barnhill to see if she can get a machine donated. There were other members who offered LuAnn machine donations.
- 11. Jo Peppey introduced Deborah Moen as our new 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President, she will be handling the programs, Deborah talked a little about what is coming up. November's program is going to be Left Right Center. You will need to bring in 3 fat quarters to play this game. If you forget and still want to play, Deborah will have fat quarters for sale for \$1.00 each and the money will go to the guild. The December program will be our social. January is going to be about cleaning your sewing machines.
- 12. Linda Weiss gave an update on the Quilt Show for February 2021. The Quilt Show will be held at the Northwest Florida Fairgrounds. Hannah Schott and Kaye Joachim are handling the boutique so if you have items to donate, please see them. Bobbi Willoughby and Deborah Moen are in charge of the Quilter's Walk. Please see them for any donations you have to the Quilter's Walk. LaLani James is in charge of the demonstrations. Please see LaLani if you want to help or do a demo at the Quilt Show. Sandra Congleton is handling all the graphic work and Bunny Orr is doing the publicity. Janet Kinner is in charge of the judging. Peggy Murrell is in charge of the receipt and return of the quilts. Linda Weiss and Pat Walker are charge of all the planning and set up. Jeanie Donnelly is in charge of the

Opportunity Quilt and Ginger Maddox is in charge of the QOV Opportunity Quilt. Also Ginger is having a QOV "Block Party" and needs helpers for doing the blocks. Kathy Crews and Ruthie Reynoso are doing the registration table. Gail Menard and Kerry Kastl are handling the vendors. Konnie Glaze is in charge of getting the volunteers to help with the Quilt Show. Please see Konnie if you are interested in volunteering. Linda Weiss has Flyers for the Quilt Show if you want to take any. The entry packet for entering a quilt into the show is now on our website. Linda said you do not need to be a member to enter a quilt into the show. Quilts entered into the Quilt Show have to have been finished after the February 2018 Quilt Show.

- 13. Linda Weiss told us that the deadline to hand in community service items is at the November general meeting. There is going to be a community service workshop/fundraiser workshop the 5<sup>th</sup> Thursday of October, 10/29/2020, at the church from 9:00 2:00. We will be wrapping up items for community service and working on fundraiser items. Pam read a note from Hannah regarding the items she needs for the Boutique.
- 14. Tickets are for sale for the QOV Fundraising Quilt. Please take tickets to buy or sell. See Sandra or Pam for tickets.
- 15. Mary Ann has clipboards to sign up for hospitality and door prizes. Thank you to those who brought in food. It was all delicious.
- 16. Ginger Maddox said the QOV display is now up at the Niceville Library. Check the library for the times they are open as they vary from day to day. The display will run until November 12. The QOV Fundraising Quilt is at Stitcher's Quest and is in the back room on display.
- 17. Pam Cortner introduced Liz Barnes as the new 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice President for workshops. Liz talked about a few classes she already has lined up. If you want to teach a class, see Liz Barnes.
- 18. Kaye Joachim is doing the October 22, 2020 workshop from 9 2. She is teaching the folded 3D Christmas Tree. See Kaye Joachim if you are interested in taking this class.
- 19. Sharon Jacobs showed the new BOM. You have one more BOM then you will get the finished instructions for the BOM at the December general meeting. There were no UFO's to showcase this month. Next month's UFO is #6.
- 20. We sang Happy Birthday to all the October birthday members. Mary Ann won the birthday drawing.
- 21. The strip club and friendship blocks are back. October the color was purple and Kaye Joachim won the strips. We are only making friendship blocks for the guild to keep and use to make a member quilt if needed. There is no drawing for the friendship blocks. November's color is anything Christmas for both the strips and for the friendship blocks.

#### September 10, 2020 - FNQG Annual Meeting

Pam Cortner called the meeting to order 10:00 am.

Liz Barnes led the prayer, and the Guild said the Pledge of Allegiance.

Attendance – 45 members, 1 guest; Margaret Jacobs.

#### **Budget Proposal**

- -Pam introduced the proposed budget and asked for questions.
- -Ginger Maddox shared that there will be no QOV fundraiser quilt in 2021. Current ticket sales will go on until February, and then there will be no quilt for the rest of the year. Income of \$850 is an estimate and is fine to leave as is.
- -Membership Appreciation Event The 2020 Quilt Retreat came out \$2200.38 ahead. Kaye Joachim brought up having a MA day with lunch provided and a guest teacher for Guild members only. Due to Covid-19, there is no conclusion of when we will have it. The monies are included in the budget proposal because we have the money to host an event.
- -Motion to accept the proposed budget was made by Penny Maus, a second to the motion was made by Kaye Joachim. The proposed budget was passed unanimously.

### **By-Laws/SOPP Review**

-Sharon Jacobs and Deborah Moen presented and answered questions regarding the proposed changes to the By-Laws and SOPPs.

### By-Laws

- There was discussion about the change to Article V, Officers. Section 1 allows for an overlap of the existing board and the new board elected in September. The existing board will step down on December 31, and the new board takes office on January 1. This overlap is most important for the treasurer's position, but can benefit all incoming officers by allowing time to learn their positions.
- -There was discussion about the inclusion of 'an officer serving in their position until a successor is elected." This verbiage is straight from Roberts Rules of Order. A special election would have to be held if there was not a candidate on the ballot, for any of the board positions, when the Guild votes at the Annual September Meeting. If we do not have officers, the organization would be dissolved.
- -There was discussion of Section 1, a, b, and c. It was voted to strike the words, "for two (2) years" from Section 1c.
- -Motion to accept the proposed By-Law changes was made by Penny Maus, a second to the motion was made by Pam Cortner. The proposed changes to the By-Laws were passed unanimously.

#### **SOPPs**

- -Sharon Jacobs read through the proposed changes to the SOPPs and there were no questions.
- -Motion to approve the revisions to the SOPPs was made by Kerry Kastl, a second to the motion was made by Janet Kinner. The proposed changes to the SOPPs were passed unanimously.

Sandra Congleton recognized the revision committee: Sharon Jacobs, Deborah Moen, Penny Maus, Jo Peppey, and Konnie Glaze.

Pam brough a cake for the guild in appreciation for giving her our trust and support. She hopes to see more participation at the workshops, sit and sews, and meetings for the upcoming year. Pam shared that we sanitize, social distance and wear masks. Pam extended a thank you to everyone who volunteers because that is what makes this guild.

#### **Election**

-Kaye Joachim thanked the Nominating Committee: Barbi Ouellette and Kathy Crews.

Kaye had the candidates stand: Pam Cortner, Deborah Moen, Liz Barnes, Anne Johnson, and Theresa Atkinson had to leave early.

- -Kaye explained the voting procedures, ballots were filled out and collected
- -Election Results: 45 members voted in person, 17 ballots were absentee for a total of 56 ballots. 32 votes are necessary for this election.

Pam Cortner – 54 votes
Deborah Moen – 54 votes
Liz Barnes – 56 votes
Anne Johnson – 55 votes
Theresa Atkinson – 55 votes
There were no invalid ballots.

Jo Peppey drew the FROG Hop winners while the ballots were counted.

Pam adjourned the meeting at 11:31 am.


