



a Jrip Down Memory Lane: Deb Chilcote, FN29 Historian

This is the 9th installment of a new series that focuses on what happened during the <u>current</u> month, and I will share tidbits of interesting information for that particular month over several years to give you a glimpse of what we did as a group.

SEPTEMBER

September has always been the month where our <u>elections for the new Board</u> happen. We applaud the current members who are still active in the guild who have given their time and effort in serving on these Boards, sometimes holding several different positions over several years. Example: <u>Doris Olig</u> — she was our first Newsletter Editor, then Secretary a few years later in 1993, and was a Vice President in 1995 & 1997. (She was also head of the Block of the Month program for several years, the current Opportunity Quilt, and has taught workshops throughout the years as well)

2000 — The **2001 Opportunity Quilt "Bumble Bee's Dream"** is finished, and tickets were ready for sale. It measured 86"x 102", the flower basket pattern was designed by member **Esther Palmer Jones**, and the border was designed by **Betty Davey**. The drawing was in May 2001, and member **Cheryl Marts** won it!

2004 — <u>Hurricane Ivan</u> came through and damaged this part of the Emerald Coast. Mary Lou Nall from Pensacola was scheduled to do a lecture on Sewing Machine Feet in October, but it was cancelled because she had lost her house due to the hurricane.

<u>2005</u> — <u>Hurricane Katrina hit New Orleans</u>, and many people evacuated to this area. Our guild collected \$480 in cash donations that <u>Pat Ferrell</u> took to the Salvation Army for their efforts in hurricane relief.

We also had <u>our first Mystery Trip</u> this year!



<u>2009</u> — The September meeting was changed from the First Presbyterian Church to the Niceville Church of Christ due to a funeral. Many liked it there, and we later voted to move there permanently in December 2009. We started meeting at our current location at the New Hope Baptist Church in August 2015.

2010 — The guild has a new website with GoDaddy.

<u>2012</u> — <u>The guild presented 2 quilts to Purple Heart recipients</u> at the National POW/MIA Recognition Day ceremony at the Air Armament Museum. Another quilt featuring patriotic stars (the Vermont Star) was donated to the museum to display.

<u>2013</u> — Mystery Quilts are becoming very popular, and member <u>Barbara Fyffe</u> started a short one this month that ended in December.

<u>2020</u> — Our fiscal year up until this year was from October through September, but <u>it was decided to have it go from January through December from now on</u>. This matches up better for bookkeeping and tax purposes. So the 2019-2020 Board served an extra three months this year, and finished in December 2020. Elections are still held in September.

FN29 Board Meeting Minutes—August 3, 2023: Diane Roberson

Meeting called to order by Kerry at 9:01 am.

Agenda items:

Nominating Committee: Diane reported that we have one candidate for president, one for 1st vice, one for 2nd vice, one for treasurer, and one for secretary. Nominations from the floor will be taken at the general meeting next week. Each candidate will have about 2 minutes to introduce themselves and speak at the August general meeting. The voting procedure for September was discussed along with the plan for absentee ballots, counting of votes, tally sheets, and the need to store ballots for one year.

QOV on display at FWB Library: Diane reported that the final arrangement for the Independency Day display dates was coordinated by Valerie Valade. The quilt will be returned to the QOV coordinator. Kerry discussed her interaction with someone interested in purchasing that particular quilt for the family of her deceased brother. Kerry explained that QOV quilts could not be sold nor presented to family members.

Proposed Budget 2024: Cheri provided a handout with the proposed budget for the guild. She discussed the shortfall in a balanced budget with a deficit of approximately \$3,990.00. Konnie offered a motion to increase membership dues from \$25.00 to \$35.00 annually starting with 2024 membership. A motion was seconded by Cheri. Board members voted approval. This will be brought before the membership at the September Annual Meeting. Discussion among those present pointed out that the dues increase to \$35.00 a year amounts to approximately \$3.00/month, dues have not increased in several years and the amount is consistent with other like organizations in the area.

Programs: Anne Johnson (absent) provided Kerry with a schedule of upcoming programs. This month's program will be "How to prepare your Quilt for the Longarm Quilter", next month will be the FROG Hop.

Retreat 2024: Konnie reports that registration will be \$15.00/day. The registration form has been revised to be easier to use and will be emailed to members this month.

Workshops: Konnie reports that the Mystery Trip for September plans are complete. Participant drivers will be provided instructions for meeting at the first stop at 10:00 am Eastern time.

Brochure: Kerry discussed a brochure developed by a new Guild member, Donna Gross. A copy was provided by email to all board members prior to meeting. Input will be provided to Donna for revisions to the draft brochure. Donna did an excellent job and has agreed to cross train with Sandra Congleton to assume media/content creation responsibilities in the future.

Announcements: Kerry discussed plans that Marisol Kingsbury has for participating in an October fundraising bazaar in Niceville. The fifth Thursday in August guild function will be dedicated to making items for sale in the boutique during this bazaar. Kerry announced that the new quilt racks for displaying quilts that were ordered have arrived and will be used for the Opportunity Quilts during this event.

Bylaws and SOPPs: Significant time was devoted to a page by page group review of the revised Bylaws and SOPPs. The committee working on the documents provided input as board members reviewed and suggested revisions to the draft. A **motion** to approve the Bylaws and SOPPs with revisions discussed today was made by Konnie and **seconded** by Diane. Verbal vote approved the motion. The revised documents will be emailed to board members then to all guild members no later than August 15th in order for all members to have the opportunity to review both documents 30 days prior to the September Annual Meeting. Both committees were commended for their work revising these vital documents.

Guild General Meeting, August 10, 2023: Diane Roberson

Meeting called to order at 10:00 am by Kerry Kastl.

Moment of reflection and pledge led by Kerry.

Membership: Lisa Lydston reports we have 60 members present including one new member Elaine Williams; and three guests: Bobbi Willoughby (former member), Leslie Cox, and Mary Weathersby (Linda Van Housen's sister). Total attendance: 63.

Presentation to New Hope: Kerry announced she had a guild presentation of \$500.00 for Bunny Wilson of New Hope Baptist Church for the church pantry supporting community members in need. This gift is a thank you for her generous donation of the pattern and quilt kit for our 2025 Opportunity Quilt Boho Heart. Unfortunately Bunny is unable to be here today to accept the gift due a serious illness of her son during travel in Georgia. Arrangements have been made to leave the gift in a secure location in the church.

Treasurer Report: Anne Johnson reports for Cherie Matheson that our current bank balance is \$26,326.80.

Minutes: Kerry verified that members received last month's general and board meetings in the August 1st edition of Needle Notes. The minutes were approved without changes.

Announcements:

Kerry read a thank you card from Annette Dowdy who received a Friendship Block quilt made by guild members and finished by Jeanie Donnelly. Billece Morrison's friend Winnie who participated in last month's trunk show also sent a thank you card.

Landmark Quilt Show in Dothan, AL will be held Oct 20-22, 2023.

Quilt Show Andalusia in Andalusia, AL will be held Nov 4-5, 2023.

Sew Full of Whimsy Quiltfest presented by six sister quilt guilds in North Florida will be held Sept 14-16, 2023 in Jacksonville, FL.

Honorary Guild Members: Five members were nominated and approved by the board for honorary membership. They are Grace Grimsley, Betty Davis, Sandra Congleton, Jonie Haught and Pat Walker. They were recognized for the long service and dedication to the guild.

Hospitality: Kerry thanked Cheryl and Sherry Kruschke for filling in for Mary Ann Sharp today and all those who brought food and door prizes.

Food Pantry: Gail Menard reported that New Hope Pantry will have a food give-away on Aug 19th to help families and individuals in need. These events are held a few times per year. Gail thanked members for participating by bringing food items from the list of needed items and monetary donations.

Retreat 2024: Kaye Joachim reported that registration forms were emailed to all members on Aug 8. She identified members who did not receive the message and plans to resolve the issue. Kaye showed the challenge fabric, T shirt design/colors, and displayed most of the sample projects that will be offered in classes. The registration form is designed for you to select events/meals by the day.

Community Service: Deborah Moan encouraged members to attend next week's Community Service workday to make kits for Christmas stockings, sandwich quilt tops, or sew stockings, drawstring bags or pillow slips. Deborah is also handling ticket sales for members only for a chance to win a Go Big fabric cutting device and accessories valued at approximately \$700.00 that was donated to the guild.

Sunshine & Shadows: Nancy Kramer sent cards to several members over the past month.

Nominating Committee: Diane Roberson, Karen Garland, and Kathy Crews contacted members and developed a slate of candidates for the five elected offices for 2024. They were: President: Kerry Kastl, 1st Vice: Anne Johnson, 2nd Vice: Konnie Glaze, Treasurer: Sherri Hayes, and Secretary: Diane Roberson. Diane opened nominations from the floor for each position. Kaye Joachim nominated Theresa Atkinson for Secretary and Diane withdrew her name for that position. Each candidate was given a few minutes to speak. Sherri was unable to attend today's meeting, Diane read her prepared statement. Diane concluded by describing the procedure for holding the election at the Annual Meeting in Sept and submitting absentee ballots that will be included in September Needle Notes.

Newsletter: Peggy Murrell announced the date for submission for the next edition of Needle Notes is Aug 24th.

Bylaws & SOPPs: Peggy, chair of the committee to review/revise the Bylaws and SOPPs reported that the proposed revised documents have been approved by the board will be emailed to all members on Tuesday, Aug 15th. This timeline is important to ensure members have 30 days to review the documents prior to discussion and vote to adopt the revised documents at the Sept Annual Meeting.

Fundraising: Kerry has coordinated with Marisol Kingsbury to hold a workday on Aug 31 for members to work on completing boutique sales items. Patterns and ideas can be found on the FNQG Facebook page and on Pinterest app.

Program Working With A Longarm Quilter: Peggy Murrell presented Tips from Bimini Quilting (Ginger Maddox) and Stitch In Time Quilts (Peggy) that provided a wealth of information and examples related to the quilt top, backing, batting, meeting with your longarmer, basting, domestic machine walking foot/free motion/ruler work and using quilting with an embroidery machine. Anne Johnson announced that next month's program will be a FROG (Fabric Requiring Other Guidance) Hop, Label, Binding, and Hanging Quilts is the October program, along with a surprise auction.








<u>Barbara Roberts</u> made this sewing booklet pouch with "pages" of sewing supply storage for when she is sewing in the car.


