

## Arizona Interscholastic Association (AIA) — NIL Guide

For AZ Legacy families — informational only. This is not legal advice. Families must review official AIA bylaws and school policies and make their own decisions.

### **What NIL Means**

"NIL" = your athlete may earn money or non-cash benefits for use of their **Name**, **Image**, **or Likeness** (e.g., social posts, appearances, camps/lessons, merch).

### Who Runs NIL Deals

- Athlete/family drives the deal. Schools and school coaches don't broker or require NIL. aiaonline.org
- Your club (Legacy) can share opportunities and education, but participation is optional and separate from team membership.

## **Green Lights (Typical OK if done right)**

- Social media promos, appearances, camps/clinics, personal merch, autograph signings.
- Working with an NIL rep/agent for NIL only (not recruiting or pro contracts).
- Doing NIL **outside** school team activities and without school resources.

# Red Flags (Likely to Jeopardize Eligibility)

- Pay-for-play/performance (bonuses for wins, stats, awards).
- Recruiting inducements (payments/benefits to choose or stay at a school).
- Using school logos, uniforms, facilities, or marks in NIL content without written school/district permission.
- Partnerships with restricted categories (e.g., gambling, alcohol, tobacco, cannabis, adult entertainment).
- Club or school requiring athletes to participate in NIL or taking a cut of athlete NIL money.

Why this matters: AIA eligibility rests on meeting all student eligibility rules. Violations can trigger team forfeits, disqualification, or other sanctions. Schools must verify compliance **before** participation. aiaonline.org

#### **Practical Guardrails for Families**



- 1. **Keep it separate from school:** No school marks or facilities in posts unless you have written approval.
- Keep it separate from the team: NIL should not affect playing time, roster status, or dues.
- 3. **Write it down:** Use a simple written agreement (scope, deliverables, compensation, timing, termination). Keep copies; your school may ask to review for eligibility. <a href="mailto:aiaonline.org">aiaonline.org</a>
- 4. **Disclose online:** Use clear tags like **#ad** or **#sponsored** to meet FTC rules.
- 5. **Mind taxes:** NIL income is taxable; track payments and talk to a tax professional.
- 6. **Ask first about logos:** School trademarks require permission; Legacy marks require club approval.
- 7. **Don't tie to performance or school choice:** Keep compensation based on time, content, or deliverables—not stats, wins, or commitments.

## Simple Pre-Deal Checklist

- □ No restricted-category sponsor.
- Do school logos/facilities (or you have written permission).
- ¬ Agreement is in writing (deliverables, pay, dates, termination).
- \( \subseteq \text{You can meet the time commitment without missing school or team obligations.} \)
- Post copy includes clear sponsorship disclosure.
- ¬ You kept a copy for your records and notified your school if they require it.
