Its huge popularity is down to the fact that it can create an unusually wide range of pitches, namely the bass (low), tone (medium) and slap (high). These sounds are created by striking different areas of the djembe skin with the hands.	The kpanlogo is traditional played with a relatively light hand technique and is not meant to produce the volume and range of tones typical of the djembe or conga drums.	A cylindrical double- headed bass drum carved from a solid Dembu log. Found throughout South America and West Africa, these powerful drums are worn over the shoulder and played with two sticks: one for the thunderous bass, the other for a bell tied to the side of the drum.

The sheep skin head and leather vertical ropes make it a durable instrument. Placing the dondo between your upper arm and your ribs and squeezing whist gently striking one head with the curved beater in the other hand, you are able to change the pitch or sound of the drum.	The ngoma is played by a standing drummer who uses both hands to strike the heads. Different parts of the player's palms and fingers strike different parts of the drumheads to produce a small variety of timbres. When two ngoma are used together, one will have a slightly lower indefinite pitch that the other.

In modern drum circle situations, the Bougarabou is often used to back up djembes in the percussion group. The Bougarabou can be played as a single drum or in a set of up to four and are normally played with only the hands in a standing position.	"Skilled drummers can create such a range of sound from them that it seems as if they can speak. This drum, called "atumpan," is a type of talking drum used by the Akan peoples of Ghana. They are usually played in pairs, or as part of a larger drum ensemble, and struck with two L-shaped drumsticks.	The Kete ensemble uses seven instruments: kwadum lead drum, apentema hand drum, petia stick drum, aburukuwa stick drum, donno hourglass-shaped tension drum, dawuro iron bell, and ntorowa gourd rattle.

Aburukuwa



It is a high-pitched talking drum used by the Akan people, bottle-shaped with

its skin is held on by pegs. It is usually played with curved sticks. It sound resembles the bird song of a bird with the same name

Kwadum



The drumhead is struck with two stick

beaters, one in each of the drummer's hands. It is the lowest-pitched drum in the *kete* ensemble and is considered the "master drum".



Petia

It is a fairly tall and narrow drum that produces a beautiful, rounded sound. The Petia

Drum Is played with a wooden stick, alternating with the palm of the hand and the fingertips.

Dawuro



The *dawuro* is a double metal bell used by the Ashanti.

It has two different pitches in an interval of an octave usually, but sometimes also a ninth. The instrument is played with a hard wooden stick or a metal rod, which are used to strike one of the bells. This produces a clear sound with a long echo.

Apentema



A fairly small sonorous drum used as a support drum. Usually played my hands. Also

use as a talking drum.

Ntorowa



The red, gold, and green coloured ntorowa have a secondary function as the Asantehene uses

these as rattles to dance. A Shakere is a hollow gourd with a net of beads on the outside that rattle against the hollow body often used in place of the Ntorowa.

The Egyptian Scarab Beetle



The scarab beetle, or dung beetle (Scarabaeus sacer), was a highly significant symbol in ancient Egyptian culture and religion:

• The sun

The scarab was associated with the sun god Ra and the Egyptian god Khepri, the divine manifestation of the morning sun. The scarab's use of its legs to roll dung into balls was thought to symbolize the sun's journey across the sky from east to west, representing the eternal cycle of life and rebirth.

• The afterlife

The scarab was believed to have regenerative powers that the deceased needed to harness in order to be reborn in the afterlife. The bodies of the dead were sometimes adorned with scarabs to help them travel safely to the next world.

• Protection

Scarabs were thought to provide protection and repel evil spirits, and were often carved into amulets, seals, and jewelry. People also wore scarab amulets for good luck.

• Hieroglyphs

The scarab often appeared in hieroglyphs, sometimes to draw attention to an important name or commemorate a significant historical event. The scarab hieroglyph, Kheper, can also refer to ideas such as existence, manifestation, development, growth, and effectiveness.

Definitions:

QAFILA

The term gafila (pl. qawafil) has its origin in the Arabic root qa fa la (قفل), which primarily means 'to return'. The word itself is used to refer to a caravan; a train of travellers; or any large party of travellers such as pilgrims or merchants moving between distant destinations



KWANZAA



The word Kwanzaa comes from the Swahili phrase, "matunda ya kwanza" or first fruits, referring to First fruits or Harvest festivals that are found throughout Africa. Kwanzaa was created in 1966 by Maulana Ron Karenga to: Reaffirm and restore African heritage and culture.

UBUDIYAH

The Arabic word ubudiyyah is related to the word ibadah, which means "obedience with submission" and has connotations of humility, obedience, and submission. Ubudiyyah can also mean "slavery". Al-'Ubudiyyah: Being a True Slave of Allah -The slavery of the heart includes both the gawl (saying of the heart) and 'amal (actions of the heart).



NABIYU

Nabiyu often links to Nabi, a name whose meaning is Prophet, Another Name for Prophet Muhammad, Messenger. The name Nabiyu: Nabi is the Hebrew naabi which Gesenius says means "one who bubbles forth" as a fountain. The Arabic lexicon, the Qamus, derives the word from nubu, "to be exalted".

According to Muslim writers a nabi is anyone directly inspired by God, and rusul and mursal, one to whom a special mission has been entrusted. Muhammad is related to have said (Mishkat, book. xxiv. ch. 1. pt. 3) that there were 124,000 ambiya, or prophet, and 315 apostles or messengers.



QATAMA



The word Qatama derives from the Inku language and means "to move with purpose." Amandla in the Nguni languages Xhosa and Zulu means "power". The word was a popular rallying cry in the days of resistance against apartheid, used by the African National Congress and its allies.

RUH Spirit, breath (of life). Used in the Quran twenty-one times, referring to the divine spirit in the sense of communication of life force. Often interpreted as an immaterial, immortal element of a living being, as well as the true self, or soul, apart from the body. Also, a designation for Jesus and the angel Gabriel.



The six compositions included in the repertory of sound produced by Mujaahid Afrikan Drum Ensemble, are symbolic of the six days required in Allah' making of Prophet Adam "peace be upon him" from the dust of the Earth shall serve as a montage of associated experiences that may illustrate in rapid sequence, the transformation of a people in time and space from slavery to freedom.
