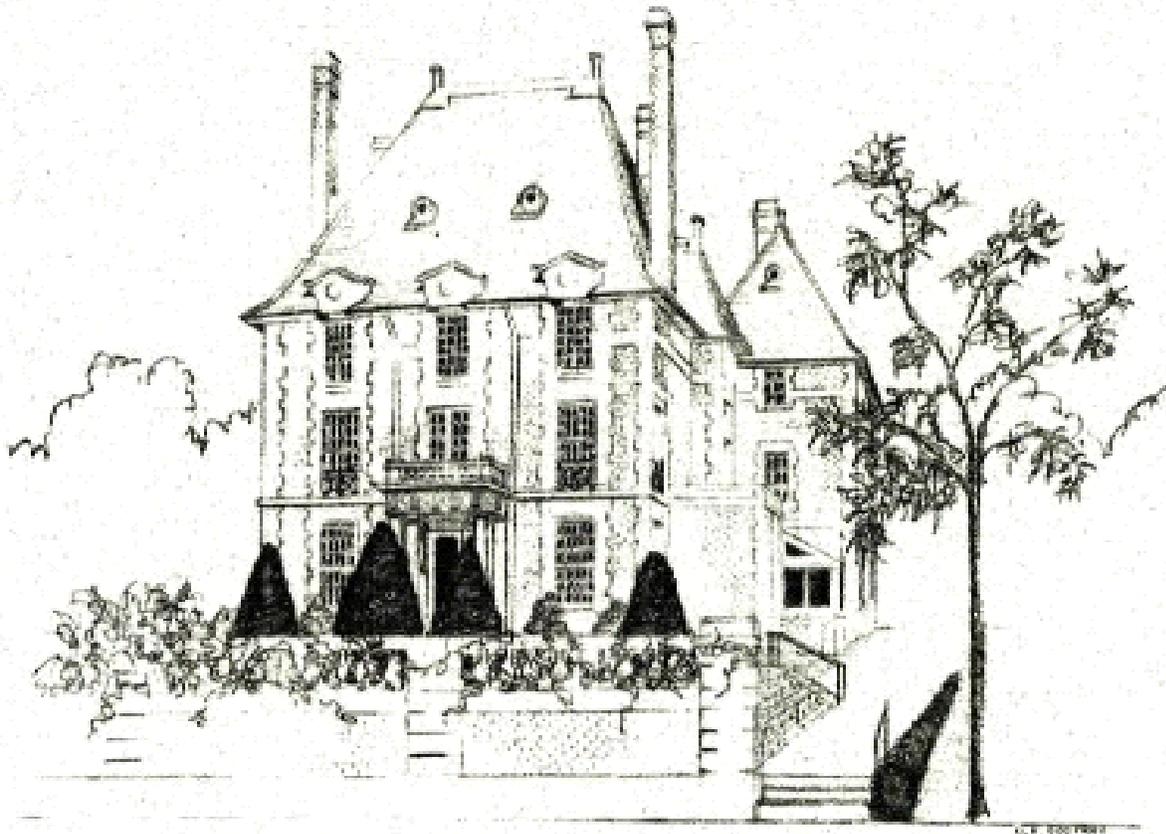

Banishment and Beyond**

Anne Hutchinson was famously banished from Massachusetts Bay in 1638 due to her controversial religious beliefs. This talk will examine Hutchinson's early life in England, her move to Massachusetts Bay, banishment, and the important role she played in founding Rhode Island. We will use primary sources, including court records and letters, to reconstruct Hutchinson's fascinating life.



Loyalists in the American Revolution

The traditional historical narrative depicts the American Revolution as almost a done deal in a quest for independence and liberty. In this talk, we'll examine the lives of several loyalists from around New England and New York to examine their values and experiences in the late 18th-century. We will use a wide range of primary sources, including letters, diaries, newspapers, court records, and images to reconstruct their lives and beliefs.

Mike is a self-taught “contemporary impressionist” artist who has been painting for 20+ years. He has taught adults previously, and is a member of the Rhode Island Watercolor Society.
