Ms. Chhaya Cook, Pennsylvania resident HiSET Track, effective June 2018

Her Personal Story & Advice:

Why did you drop out of high school? I dropped out of high school in ninth grade because I was getting bored. I did not feel like I was being challenged enough to engage in my work, so I decided to just drop out. That was the biggest mistake I had ever made in my life. I felt like I had given up too easy and for that life was not easy for me. After I dropped out, I struggled with getting a good job. I felt less than a person like I was not smart enough. I missed going to my prom. I did attend Job Corps, maybe six months after I dropped out, because I wanted better for my life. I enrolled into cooking class and GED classes at the time. It was a good experience. I received a certificate in culinary arts. I took my GED test and got real high scores on writing, social studies and language arts, but never took the math part of the test. I needed to take science over. I graduated from job corps without my GED, and I was devastated. I went through life sad because I still wanted my diploma. I needed it to tell myself that I can do this, and I will never have to struggle ever again. I made several attempts after job corps. I entered into the community college GED program, but had to leave because I was pregnant. I lived life the best I could, but I still yearned for my high school diploma. I needed it to feel fulfilled. Now, here I am (many years later) at YOURpath for Adult Learners, and I am doing it. I am making one of my biggest dreams come true. I am working hard to get my diploma because I have been sad for years since I did not have it. I had jobs here and there, but nothing is more joyful than having your high school diploma, a good job and achieving a lifelong goal, for which you fought so hard and so many times to get, but something always got in your way, causing you not to be able to get it.

What are your plans after you earn your high school diploma? First, I am going to celebrate me because I did this through trials and tribulations, and I wanted to quit so many times. I am going to stand proud and know that I took the time to finally complete something that I kept putting off for many years. I am going to enroll into college. I am going to start planning for my future, and what type of career I want to have. This will not be the end for me. I am going to keep going because I deserve it. I overcame so much, and this will be my moment to shine. I want to tell others out there to always put themselves first. Go out there, and do what you need to make your life better. You cannot help others if you cannot help yourself first. Know that you matter; you are smart, and you can do this! It takes time and sacrifice, but it will be worth it for you in the end.
