## Our New Curriculum Courses

Since our conception, YOURpath has been committed to making sure that our students are successful in acquiring the knowledge and skills needed for them to pass their GED or HiSET exam and earn their high school (H.S.) equivalency diploma. We focus on making sure that all students enter in the program with a concrete plan of action in terms of testing, passing and earning their H.S. credential. We ensure that students are committed to meeting expectations (minimum study hours and grades of 80% or better) and passing their official exam at or near the college readiness level. In support of our latter efforts, we have recently implemented our "New Curriculum Courses" which are designed to take students deeper into each subject area as they develop stronger content knowledge about various topics and concepts. Students are exposed to a variety of text-sets and are able to demonstrate their knowledge and skill-sets through a variety of platforms and useful tools. Over the past year, we have been able to identify where our students struggle mostly (e.g. the scientific method, interpreting data, essay writing and word problems) and design courses that will address these collective areas of weaknesses for our students. We know that these courses will help us to achieve our goals, especially our aim to get students passing scores at or near the college readiness level.
