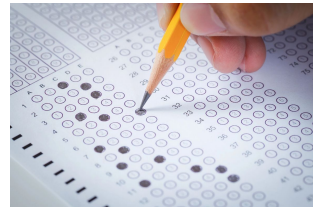




ACCEPTING FALL APPLICATIONS FOR OUR FREE GED/HISET PREP PROGRAM

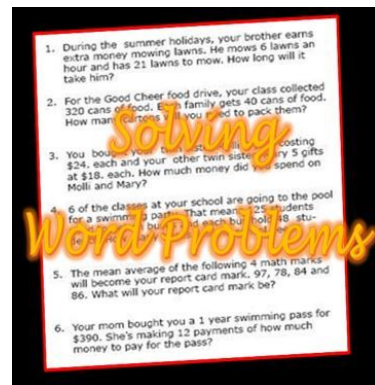
NEW CURRICULUM COURSES

We are enthused about the "Roll Out" of our new curriculum courses. These courses allow students to focus on specific subject-topics where they tend to struggle the most. Our most recent release is our course "**Solving Word Problems.**" This course is all about solving algebra word problems.

The prerequisite for this course is students' ability to solve algebra expressions and equations.

Students who have demonstrated proficiency in solving algebra expressions and equations are ready to take the "**Solving Word Problems**" course, which focuses on how to solve the various types of word problems *such as numbers, time, rate, and distance, mixtures, coins, age, work, geometric figures, etc.*

Students who successfully complete this course will be ready to tackle any word problem that they encounter on their GED or HiSET exam. Along with this course, students who are completing their reading content subject areas, are encouraged to enroll in our "**Interpreting Data**" and "**Essay Writing**" courses so that they are ready to successfully demonstrate proficient skills in these specific areas on their official GED or HiSET exam.
