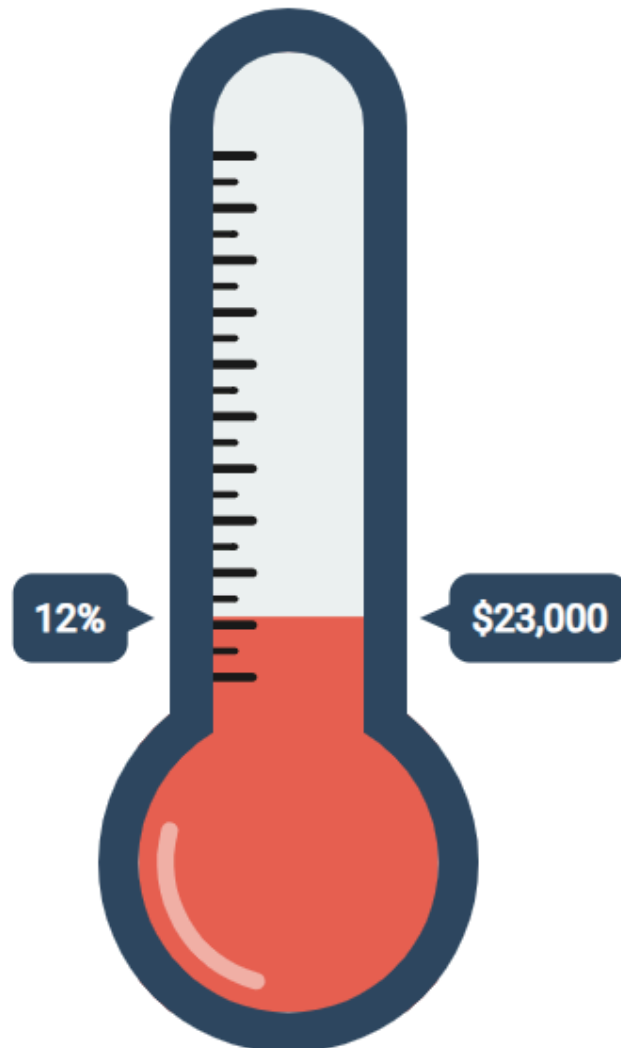

- Empower more adults to achieve their learning and career aspirations.

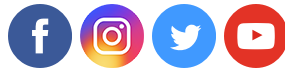
