WFLC is founded upon values of empowerment, collaboration, and coalition building. WFLC is a group of social service providers that assists, educates, and develops people from low-income communities to elevate themselves and achieve career success. Our network of providers, educational organizations, and training institutions, provide support services, barrier removal and skills development needed to be ready to work, then connect individuals to employers ready to hire.

Economic empowerment originates at the source of success and independence. WFLC increases access to the resources people need to meet their unique background and employment interests. WFLC helps its partners have greater impact by leveraging complementary resources to provide clients with comprehensive support to more quickly secure employment.

Our vision is to use economic empowerment as the catalyst for generational wealth and stability. We envision a future where individuals are equipped with the resources and opportunities to build a strong financial foundation through education, entrepreneurship, and asset acquisition. THE COLLECTIVE IMPACT MODEL

CREATING IMPACT WITH EFFICIENCY

The concept of the WFL CollectiveTM Collective Impact Model is founded upon the principle that large-scale social change requires a collaborative approach that doesn't focus on a singular problem: each problem is related to several others and this is why they are so difficult to solve (Kania, 2011). By assembling various businesses, nonprofits, government organizations, and individual leaders and working together to address different pieces of the larger problem, large-scale change can be achieved.

The WFL Collective™ Collective Impact Model also offers the opportunity to connect employment candidates to social services, training, and education which addresses the systemic issues that can prevent work readiness. Beyond initial job placement,

The WFL Collective™ Impact Model components include: partnership development, community outreach and referrals, employment pre-screening, case management, and a recognition program.

the model provides a career pathway that enables the employment candidate to earn greater wages over time.

Social **Justice** has been component of all public discourse since the summer of 2020. WFL Collective™ expects to add to that public discourse by focusing on using a collective impact model that leverages technology, private industry resources. government policy to deliver a solution based on best practices. WFLC will advocate influencing government policies that ensure investments are in workforce development, education, and training. WFLC will need to create consistent and ongoing messaging targeting politicians, government agencies, and think tanks in an effort to impact the budgeting process.

Project Community Capital® (PCC) is an economic empowerment platform that connects people in underserved communities with jobs and contracts by leveraging social capital. PCC bridges the social capital of employment decision-makers of companies with individuals in low-income communities. PCC finds, vets, and connects candidates to employers, and entrepreneurs to firms and contractors—compiling exceptional, underserved individuals with unique talents and business acumen.

- The **Workforce Leverage** platform consists of structured employment services through a collective impact model that leverages social capital, social services, and technology.
- The **Heighten The Hustle** Program is all about entrepreneurship elevation, whether through course or counsel, entrepreneurs learn the basics of business development and can even receive grant money to prop up their businesses.
- The **Firm Advantage** arm consists of avenues for subcontracting opportunities and business advice.

Project Community Capital® (PCC) is an economic empowerment platform that connects underserved communities with employment and contracts by leveraging social capital and technology, offering structured employment services and business guidance through its Workforce Leverage and Firm Advantage arms. Through PCC, individuals are matched with suitable employers, while entrepreneurs gain access to subcontracting opportunities and business advice.



In the short term, our economic empowerment platform with a key emphasis on social capital, but in the long term, Project Community Capital® aims to foster experience and job stability for underserved individuals. PCC utilizes our network and social capital to employ low-income individuals who struggle to find work otherwise, ultimately growing their social capital as well.

We connect ready-to-work candidates in lowincome communities to entry-level employment, serving as a bridge to long-term careers. With a focus on innovative solutions, PCC aims to address issues nationwide. unemployment With remarkable employee retention rate of 94%-98%, we not only secure employment but also ensure its longevity. Our vision is to streamline the hiring process for employers through the Workforce application, reducing Leverage™ costs turnover while providing stable employment opportunities for individuals in need.





THE POWER OF SOCIAL CAPITAL

ESTABLISHING YOUR NETWORK

Fifty-six percent of jobs are found using social capital, and seventy percent of jobs are not publicly marketed. PCC's goal is to get low-income residents employed through the most effective employment tool: social capital. Affluent and connected people often have extensive networks and get employed easily. Underserved people rarely have that opportunity. PCC tips the scale.

Social capital is capital based on relationships that provide useful support when needed and those relationships are built on trust.

PCC helps build social capital for low-income individuals. By leveraging social capital under a collective impact model, PCC can be a stepping-stone to long-term job opportunities, a bridge to building social capital for its members, and a means to reduce extreme economic inequality. If PCC can accomplish this, it will change employment practices in general and could help increase the income of more than 15 million people.

A lack of social capital has impacted generations of families who have been unable to access employment opportunities. Once underserved and underestimated ready-to-work residents get started on a more stable employment journey, their social capital networks will grow as well, sustaining the power of social capital and boosting employment.



Regular consultations with executive members connect participants to invaluable networking opportunities and strategic pathways to success.

In 2024, the Cleveland MLK Plaza Pitch Competition, held on October 19th, elevated this initiative further. Hosted at DigitalC, the event showcased 11 passionate entrepreneurs competing for funding and the opportunity to secure a space in the Black-owned business market at MLK Plaza. Each participant presented their innovative ideas, followed by a Q&A with the judges, making a compelling case for their place in this historic marketplace.

This year's competition featured a diverse lineup of businesses, including sustainable fashion, authentic Caribbean spices, and wellness solutions. The top three winners received cash prizes and tailored mentorship opportunities. All participants benefited from exposure, constructive feedback, and continued support through PCC's partnerships.


