Brother Clarance Lawson



Clarence Lawson began his journey in in Masonry, in 1978 at Pyramid 869 in Vilseck Germany while stationed there during his time in the US Army. After being raised June of 78, he was elected to serve as Senior Warden in September of that same year, and became the acting master in 1979. Upon retirement and returning to the States, he joined St. Andrews Lodge 18 in Cynthiana in 2009. He was elected Master there in 2012, and has served as Treasurer since 2017. In 2019 he was elected to Master at Amity 40, and again in 2013.He is the current Senior Deacon at Amity currently as well!

We also live in a perpetual state of hurry. There is a constant rush to bring in more members simply to pay the bills. In another recent incident, a lodge that prides itself on bringing in many members for financial reasons, is now facing the cost of that mindset.

We would never invite a stranger into our personal lives or families without knowing whether they are truly worthy. So why do it in a lodge? A place where we trust these men to be our brothers, too keep us accountable, and upon whom we rely in times of darkness.. Being a Freemason is and should always be a privilege and honor, not just a means to cover expenses
