The Illinois Lodge of Research

The Illinois Lodge of Research was chartered in 1976 by the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge A.F. & A.M. of Illinois as the only Masonic Research Lodge duly chartered in Illinois. It was formed for the purposes of studying, researching, and recording the history and philosophy of Freemasonry.

Membership in the Illinois Lodge of Research is open to all Master Masons who are in good standing in a regular Masonic Lodge. Although the Illinois Lodge of Research is a state-wide lodge, it neither confers degrees nor competes with regular Masonic Lodges. Master Masons do not have to demit from their regular Masonic Lodge to join the Illinois Lodge of Research. Also eligible to join are regularly constituted Masonic Lodges, libraries, and related bodies.

Meetings of the Illinois Lodge of Research provide a forum for the open discussion of Masonic events, personages, and current events important to Freemasonry. Our annual meeting is held during Grand Lodge's Annual Communication every October, in the mid-afternoon of the Friday after the first Grand Lodge session.

Members, as well as non-members, are welcome to attend our Annual Meeting, where a brief business meeting is held and a speaker is always featured presenting a fascinating topic on some aspect of Masonic education.

About the Lodge and Services the Lodge Provides

The Illinois Lodge of Research does not confer Masonic degrees nor does it hold frequent regularly-stated meetings (other than the Annual Meeting held during the time of Grand Lodge Grand Communication). Instead, the Lodge serves as a resource and respite for those brethren interested in Masonic education, research, and the scholarly pursuit of topics to enrich their comprehension and understanding of Freemasonry.

The Lodge provides these services and benefits to our members:

- A Masonic library and museum located at the Normal Masonic Temple in Normal, Illinois
- Our Annual Transactions, which is a compendium of research papers and presentations created throughout the year by our members
- Masonic Education Symposiums, where brethren gather to learn about Masonic research and writing as well as to experience papers and presentations from noted authors and researchers
- The Lamp, our online journal, located at IllinoisLodgeOfResearch.com, that features regular postings of Masonic education
- Interaction with other members and Masonic scholars at our online forum

- Research services available upon request and as time is permitted, the Library's volunteer staff will undertake research on behalf of interested parties (extensive research requests may require reimbursement for copies, postage, etc.)
