- 1. The rough ashlar, the perfect ashlar, and the Trestle Board.
- 2. Temporal means worldly or physical building. Later in the description this is compared to the Mason's "spiritual building" (opposite).
- 3. Discuss. Answers should circle around the idea, 'To heed God's guidance in our daily lives.'
- 4. Share and discuss.
