RVs, Trailers and Campers: Propane and Barbecue Safety Tips

When Transporting Cylinders:

- Ensure propane cylinders are upright and secure during transport.
- Keep cylinder valves closed and protected during transport.
- Plug or cap cylinder outlets during transport.

When Using Cylinders:

- Ensure cylinders are upright and secure on a firm footing.
- Check cylinder connections and hoses for leaks by brushing a 50/50 mix of liquid soap and water onto all connections and hoses. Rising bubbles when you turn on the valve indicate a leak. Tighten connections or repair the hose until there are no bubbles.
- Keep cylinders away from flame, heat, and exits.

Using Propane in your RV or Camper:

- Keep all combustion exhaust vents on the exterior wall of your RV or camper clear of obstructions.
- Use stovetop burners or ovens only for cooking and not as a source of heat.
- Propane appliances require an adequate supply of fresh air for proper combustion. Ensure your RV or camper is properly ventilated to prevent build-up of carbon monoxide.
- Install a carbon monoxide alarm and propane leak detector.

Barbecue Safety:

- Ensure barbecues are on firm, level footing.
- Keep barbecues well away from the side of your RV, camper or tent, and other combustibles.
- Make sure igniter buttons work properly before turning the gas on. If there is no igniter, insert a long match or barbecue lighter through the side burner hole before you turn on the grill controls.
- Keep barbecues clean of grease to prevent flare-ups.
- Stay by the grill when cooking and keep kids and pets at a safe distance.
- Turn off all burner controls and tank valves after each use.


Recently, the Nolalu Community Centre benefited from a clean-up day. Volunteers worked outside and in to spruce up the building and grounds after the Covid hiatus.



Old Fashioned Strawberry Jam-From Grassroots June, 1974

5 cups strawberries

5 cups sugar

1/2 cup lemon juice

Wash the strawberries, hull and drain thoroughly. Heat the sugar in a 325F degree oven, 15 to 20 minutes.

Place the strawberries in a large saucepan. Crush slightly to extract some juices. Cook 10 minutes over low heat, stirring occasionally. Pour the hot sugar over the hot strawberries. Add the lemon juice. Bring to a boil, stirring often. Boil 8 minutes over high heat. Put into hot sterilized jars, cool and seal.

Did you know that Canada is the only country in the world that has had a continuous series of birth records for more than 3 centuries, dating from the code of laws in Ouebec in 1621.

Wildflowers

As I settle into life in the North, I am in awe of all it has to offer. This year I have learned more about plant life than I have in my whole life. I am amazed at the wildflowers that grow in the fields and ditches, the edible plants and berries, and so many herbal uses for it all. I am a budding herbalist and make my own tinctures and salves. Retiring has allowed me the freedom to pursue this interest and learn so much more about what plants can do for you.

I was surprised when I saw wild lupins growing in the ditch. The colours so vibrant and the plants so healthy. I have since found daisies, campanula, black eyed Susan, fireweed, blessed thistle, and huge ferns. Of course I picked some for my table, went back and dug some up for my garden around the house, and marked the area and went back and gathered seeds. I wanted to make sure I had native plants in my garden as it makes growing so much easier. I can't wait to see what this next month brings.

Wildflowers have many benefits to both us and the environment. The most important reason to grow wildflowers is they tend to be more resilient than exotic garden plants, requiring less water and maintenance once established. They also attract beneficial pollinators such as bees and butterflies. And...they are beautiful! A wildflower is a plant that grows in wild spaces like forests and meadows. However, it's important to know that many wildflowers native to northern Ontario can be grown successfully in your own garden as well.

I have been fortunate to have good teachers in herblore, and of course there are many books available and the internet is easy for searching up information. I am currently drying spearmint, catnip, clover, and chamomile. I found all of these while out walking on our property. I was able to make a dandelion syrup for the first time this year. It is sweet but tangy. I have also made chamomile tincture, daisy tincture, catnip tincture, and a clover tincture. With the cold infused oils I have made I was able to make a bug balm for my grandson. The bugs really like him and he swells up something awful The bug balm soothes the itch so it doesn't get as bad. I have also made cold infused oils of peppermint, lavender, arnica, and St. Johns Wort. I combined the peppermint and lavender oils to make a salve for sore muscles. I am truly blessed to be able to follow this passion for herbal remedies, and to have so much available in my own backyard. 
