Dance Department;

Our Year 9 Dance specialism has been involved with crating their own Tic Toc dances and taking inspiration from the many that already out there. Some super creativity and ideas.

Year 10 GCSE Dance have been keeping-up with their dance appreciation skills. We are currently looking at the professional work Emancipation of Expressionism, a Hip Hop work, in particular the way that the choreography, costume and lighting have been used to communicate the intentions of the work to the audience. A really high-level of extended-written work have been submitted.

The year 11 students completed their practical exams (60% of the course) before lockdown started. So, to expand and develop their critical appreciation skills, they have been independently researching a professional work that is outside of the prescribed works – Scattered, by MotionHouse.
