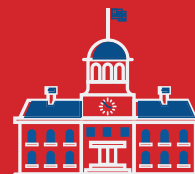

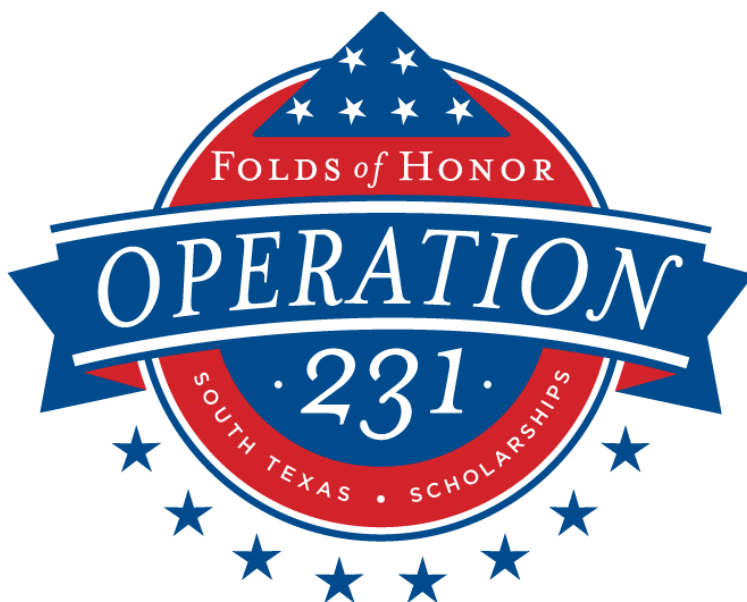

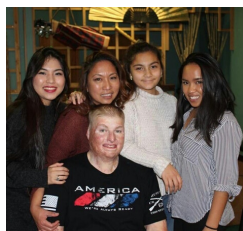

# RECIPIENT FAMILIES



Retired United States Navy Petty Officer 1st Class Michael Lammy honorably served our country for over nine years during OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM. On December 1st, 2006, PO1 Lammy was on the U.S.S Frank Gable when he sustained a life changing injury after a damaged boiler on the ship exploded. PO1 Lammy sustained 3rd degree burns to 48% of his body by 1200-degree steam that quickly filled the room. Michael's wife, Rose, is a 2018-2019 Folds of Honor Higher Education Scholarship Recipient studying Advertising and Fine Arts at the Art Institute of San Antonio. Michael and Rose also have three daughters, one is a past recipient and 2 are current Children's Fund recipients.



Retired United States Marine Corps Sgt. Marty Gonzalez joined the Marine Corps in 1998. While part of Kilo Co. at Camp Pendleton, he deployed to Fallujah, Iraq on September 11th, 2004 as part of Operation Phantom Fury. During the mission, he was struck twice by grenades, and was also shot twice in his right arm. Sgt. Gonzalez endured 10 surgeries in less than a year to salvage his right arm. He also had 3 major back surgeries in an attempt to repair his broken back. Sgt. Gonzalez was paralyzed for several years and had to learn to stand and walk again. He continues to battle several ongoing health issues and surgeries in an ongoing effort to repair his broken back. Sgt. Gonzalez currently lives in Cypress, TX with his wife, Tawnee, and their four children who are each Folds of Honor scholarship recipients.
