The Mother Earth Cultural Conservation Society (MECCS) was founded to protect the McLeans Lake area and to revitalize the land and culture for all people.

We are based in the Bonaparte Indian Band — St'uxwtéws in our Secwepemc language — in what is now British Columbia.

Founded by Elder Arthur Morgan, along with his friend John Skoda, his son Dario, and supported by family and surrounding communities, MECCS blends ancestral teachings with modern tools to reconnect our people and care for the land.







## Our Teaching and the Land

### To us, the land is family – for all.

We never raised a hand to Mother Earth. We honored her through ceremony, dance, song, and spirit. From her, we received everything we needed to live well:

- Food, clothing, and tools from the animals
- Shelter and firewood from the forests
- Life and flow from the water
- Growth and light from the sun
- Healing and rest from the darkness

# Our Mother is Hurting





### Today, the land is under stress:

- Climate change and wildfires are increasing
- Lakes are drying
- Forests are under pressure

Roads and logging have fragmented the land. Streams that once fed McLeans Lake are now choked or dry.

Fish populations are declining.

Wildlife is under pressure.

Erosion and overhunting threaten delicate ecosystems.
