SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All classes are open to all.
- 2 No entry fees – no prize money.
- All entries should be received by the Show Organiser by Wednesday 20st August 2025.
- Exhibitors having entered and wishing to withdraw from a class where a large amount of space is required, (i.e. pot plant classes/championships/) are requested to advise the Show Organiser before 5pm on Friday 22rd August.
- The committee have full authority to accept or refuse an entry without stating the reason.
- Exhibits may be staged between 6pm-9pm on Friday 22rd and 8am-10am on Saturday 23th August.
- All exhibits must be the property of the exhibitor for not less than two months prior to the show and must have been grown by him/her in gardens or allotments owned or rented by him/her (except in Floral Arrangement classes).
- Exhibitors may stage only one entry in each class.
- Vases and all receptacles must be provided by the exhibitor.
- Class cards will be provided at the show. Exhibitors must place them face downwards in front of the exhibit.
- Exhibits should be correctly named where possible. Errors in naming will not disqualify but, in close competition, judges may give preference to correctly named exhibits.
- 12 The judges may withhold any award if, in their opinion, the entries do not merit one being made.
- The judge's decision regarding the relative merits of exhibits will be final.
- All exhibits must remain staged until 4pm on the last day of the show. No prior removal will be allowed 14
- Exhibitors are encouraged to donate surplus flowers, fruits and vegetables to be sold at our plant stall during the weekend. All proceeds from the show will be in support of Victoria School.
- All exhibits are accepted at the risk of the exhibitor and the organisers shall not be liable for loss or damage or any other Cause whatsoever.
- The horticultural classes will be judged under RHS rules. The floral arrangement classes will be judged under 17 N.A.F.A.S. rules.
- All exhibitors entering and staging their exhibits will be given a free admission ticket to the show. 18
- Cups and trophies will be presented on Sunday 24th August at 3.30pm
