Quilting Tips and Tricks (Paula Riccio)

I am sending you a tip I found by making a mistake. I was working on an applique' for a quilt and I ironed the Hotfix Fabric Pre-fused fabric on the wrong side of the fabric. I did not have enough fabric to redo the applique'. So I thought I would try putting the fabric in the freezer and hopefully Hotfix would peel it off, well it worked. I was able to peel off the fused glue and could reuse the fabric.




HEROES' PASSAGE

a retreat for veterans

Veterans' Outreach was donated 110 acres of KY wilderness by Roger Hanshaw. Plans are underway to develop Heroes' Passage, a healing

environment for post 9/11 veterans that are having problems with transitioning to civilian life. Plans include a CORE facility (Counseling, Offices, Recreation, and Eatery) private cabins for each veteran, working farm, horse stable, Chapel, and tribute garden. We have contacts in place for therapy, job training, and job placement to help each veteran overcome and enjoy a

OUR MISSION

Veterans' Outreach has the primary mission of honoring and serving all veterans. Each veteran has unique needs. We use our program resources to offer a hand up, not a hand out to benefit veterans and in turn communities and this great nation.



WHO WE ARE:

Veterans' Outreach is a 501c3 non-profit charitable organization serving veterans since 1994. We are registered with the IRS and in each state that we serve, as required by law. We have a dedicated, energized, and hard working Board of Directors, Staff, Volunteers, and Auditing Firm. We all come together to work for the common goal of honoring and serving each veteran we meet, one at a time.



WHAT WE DO:

Over the last 29 years, we have helped veterans more than 150,000 times through our programs that perform our mission to help veterans including:

The Direct Aid Program provides veterans up to \$200 per veteran per year. Direct aid needs have included, but are not limited to shelter, rent, utilities, food, auto repair, clothing, and relocation.

We work with veterans to help them find employment, either through our side employers, or through our own Workforce Program called the Outreach Program.

We offer free clothing and personal items to veterans through our Heroes Closet Program. We've dressed veterans for every occasion.

The Freedom Food Pantry Program provides healthy fresh foods and non-perishables all year long to eliminate hunger insecurity for veterans.

We work in harmony with other agencies that support and enhance veterans' lives.

We assist WWII veterans and their families with registration for the National WWII Memorial.

Veterans' Outreach pledges to operate in a manner that honors every donor, every partner, and all the relationships that we've built over the last 28 years. We are proud to have an average ratio of 80/20 with 80% of every dollar going towards helping veterans.


