Donations have been very good! I donated to the hospital:

Quilts 10 Stuffed chemo hearts 55
NICU hearts 78 Infusion lab throws 7
Burp cloths 34 Knitted toddler hats 9
Bears 78 Chemo head scarves 2

Remember we can make 36x42 sized throws for the infusion lab. Flannel on one side or both sides. No batting. You can sew the outer edge and then turn them right side out so no binding. You can quilt them with a walking foot, or tack them down by machine, or by hand. Now the new moms would like them for a covering when they nurse.

I should have some yarn to give out if anyone would like to add it to any yarn you have to make shawls for the new moms. Labor and deliver can also use newborn sized hats. Remember newborn means it will fit a grapefruit, which is not very big. They can be crochet or knitted. Pastel colors or holiday/season colors such as red/white/blue for now.

You have all been very enthusiastic about donations and I appreciate you!

A Scrap Buster Quilt or Table Runner Finished Quilt 69" x 81" or 69" x 21"

MATERIALS

Yardage is based on 42"-Width of Fabric (WOF). This is a scrap buster quilt in 8 different colors. (Color) is the color referred to in the pattern. The amounts needed for the table runner are in [red] if different from the quilt.

- Various scraps, in various shades, (at least ¾" wide) that amount to 1/4 yard, or a fat quarter, each, of (Red), (Orange), (Yellow), (Green), (Teal), (Blue), (Purple) and (Brown) for blocks.
- 4 [1-1/4] yards of (White) for blocks, sashing and outer border.
- 2-1/4 [1/2] yards of (Black) for blocks, sashing, cornerstones, and inner border.
- 3/4 [1/2] yard of (White) recommended for binding.
- 5-1/8 [1-3/4] yards for backing with 5" overage. (White) recommended.
- 79" x 91" [79" x 31"] piece of cotton batting with 5" overage.
- (30) [5] sheets 8.5" x 11" scrap paper for foundation piecing.
- 6" square up ruler
- Optional, but helpful, would be a wooden iron or small portable iron with pressing mat.

Quilting & Finishing

- 1.) Pin and sew the inner Black and outer White borders. Pay attention to the different sizes for either the quilt or the table runner in [red]. Be sure to measure your quilt top before sewing the borders together.
- 2.) Layer, quilt, and bind.
- 3.) Congratulations- your quilt is complete!

Fabric Book Construction Workshop with Norma Santiago

Date: May 19

Time: 10 a.m. - 4 p.m.

Location: Beach Art Center, 1515 Bay Palm Blvd., Indian Rocks Beach

Cost: \$20 Beach Art Center Fee (No charge for instructor)

In this workshop we are going to be looking at four different techniques that can be used to construct fabric books. Fabric books can be used to create a combination of a stitch, textile or cloth book, or journals. Learn about multiple methods of creating and binding books. At the end of the day, each student will have created four different books with the addition of illustrations or stitches.

Materials needed for workshop:

Fabrics - Muslin, any commercial fabric or your own dyed fabrics

Book 1 - 6 1/2 by 12 inches - 8 pieces

Book 2 - 5 inches by 10 inches 8 pieces

Book 3 - 6 inches by 12 inches 8 pieces

Book 4 - 1 fat quarter (18 by 22 inches)

Sewing needles and thread

Tapestry or chenille needle

Perlé Cotton size 8, or 6 strand floss; colors can be matching or contrasting

Scissors


Iron and Iron mat

Starch, sizing or Best Press type of spray

Optional rotary mat and rotary cutter.
