Trash/Recycling/Dumping

Trash, recycling, yard waste and compost pick up occurs weekly on Wednesdays year-round (except on observed city holidays). Feel free to leave your cans out after 4pm on Tuesday afternoon. Please retrieve your cans by Wednesday evening. Per the Community Guidelines, please keep trash and recycling cans inside personal fences during the rest of the week to mitigate the risk of rodents and persons using the cans as public trash.

If your cans are not emptied, you can report a missed pickup by calling the Solid Waste Hotline before 10 a.m. on Thursday: 703-248-5160.

Recycling: Plastic bags or any type of flexible plastic should never go in your curbside recycling cart. This includes single-use grocery store bags, trash bags/liners, dry-cleaning bags, Ziplock or Saran Wrap, the plastic bags your newspaper is delivered in, and the plastic bubble wrap used in packages. These flexible plastics get tangled and jam up the material sorting machines at recycling processing plants. Be sure to follow the guidelines on what can be accepted

Note: City of Falls Church no longer accepts glass bottles and jars for curbside collection. If you would like to recycle glass, a purple container can be found at the Recycling Center (217 Gordon Rd.) Be sure to follow the guidelines on what can be accepted.

Compost: If you are interested in composting, the City has a free 24-hour community compost program, with a drop off location located in the back of the City Hall and Community Center parking lot (300 Park Ave). Participants are asked to please review the compost rules to make sure everyone using the bin knows what can and can't be composted.

The City is also part of a Curbside Compost program which is a voluntary, fee-based service open to any City of Falls Church resident receiving curbside solid waste services. The program consists of weekly pick-ups of food scraps and other organic matter. To learn more visit, <https://compostcrew.com/fallschurch/>

Bulk Trash: If you have large items to dispose of, please contact the City to schedule a bulk pickup. All key information and online scheduling is available on the City's website or you can call the Solid Waste Hotline at 703-248-5160.

Yard Waste: Yard waste must be placed in 30-gallon paper yard debris bags (plastic bags are not acceptable) with a yellow sticker that can be obtained from City Hall or Browns Hardware. Acceptable materials include grass, leaves, and trimmings too small to be included as bundled brush arising from general landscape maintenance.
