
TIME IS OUT OF JOINT

'Time is Out of Joint is an immersive musical experience produced by North East based musician and composer, John O'Hare with live music performed by a.b.a.d.e.'



GLAD TOWN GHOST - THESE WITCHING HOURS

I'm finding it hard to believe that this was recorded in Blighty and not across the Atlantic in some sort of forest shack. I should say as a caveat that I usually hate music like this. By 'this' I mean music with banjos. Except that scene from Deliverance (classic!)

However Glad Town Ghost, or Dale to his pals is certainly accomplished at what he does.

'The Cleveland Water' kicks off Dales new E.P. I'm not well versed in water of the Cleveland variety but I once drank from The Skerne and I've never been quite the same since. More on that in a future issue.

I also have no knowledge of Americana but I certainly am an advocate of the old Harmonica (as featured in 'Consecutive Towns') and it sounds rather apt in Dale's repertoire.

His words are well formulated and crafted into stories which are in fact 'five character studies of imposters, saints and lovers.' Melancholic and thoughtful, without slipping towards a mire of sentimentality. Some of the vocals do sound a bit 'put on' at times like he's trying to imitate an obscure Simpsons character, but on the whole Dale's gruff voice holds up well with a certain uniqueness to it. There's a nice width to the mix and it's not too polished which suits the songs, keeping with the 'pastoral' quality of the music.



The highlight of the E.P is 'La Da Da Da' which could easily be used as the music for one of those American road movies soundtracking the grandiose panning shots of rolling hills, lakes and mountains. 'These Witching Hours' is a quaint E.P that will appeal to neo - folkies 3.8/5



So who is this enigmatic and shadowy figure, Necro? And what is his evening all about? Full name Necro Noise, the horror movie influenced Dark Synth producer hails from the deepest, darkest depths of North Shields and is intent on providing a necromantic night of musical debauchery for all who dare enter.

Necro's Night is an electronic music event that aims to bring 'horror back to da club' by way of live performances from solo artists and bands. Mainly focussing on the darker side of music but also lighter synthpop artists such as Jake Major from time to time. The evening climaxes with a massive D.J set by the eponymous Necro Noise, (a Dark Synth producer in his own right) playing a variety of tracks from genres as diverse as Synth Pop, Synth Wave, Cyber Punk, Dark Synth, Dark Wave and French House plus a range of his own productions.

As most of you are probably aware, I'm somewhat of a horror fanatic myself, so the aesthetics of the premise and the promotional material were appealing to me and I'm interested to see how everything evolves.

Necro's Night 1 & 2 which took place at Little Buildings and The Cluny 2 respectively featured the likes of Holy Braille (who are back for Necro's Night 3), Gaydar, Jake Major and Squarms.

The third in the current trilogy takes place at Zerox on Saturday May 17th featuring Holy Braille and Glasgow's Ubre Blanca. Tickets are priced at £5 advance and £8 OTD with hell breaking loose at 7.15.

G.A.O.N MACHINE MUSIC

I've seen our lord and Dirgemeister (aka Roz) and his popular beat-combo Machine Music once before and they are a tight and pleasing unit. Roz and Dave ripped through their short set of sweet songs without pomp or ceremony and are so cool they don't even have to wear sunglasses on stage. With bass, guitar and a drum machine I didn't hate (I'm a proper drum snob) the lads' set was replete with enjoyable indie/rock/pop ditties full of sometimes dark and sometimes amusing lyrics. Short, to the point, get off stage, job done. I like that.

The Golden Age of Nothing promised much with an electric violin (it's actually a viola - Roz) and a guitar. Again, the drum machine was passable to this drummer's upturned snout. However I was a bit bored at first by the seemingly identical tempo and pacing of each song. Nothing really stood out. But as their set went on I found myself enjoying the swirly sameness of the music. The vocals were too bland for my taste. Perhaps if I could've heard the lyrics I may have had a different opinion.

Ceiling Demons had a backing track too, but as they are a hiphop/rap outfit the lack of dynamics in the percussion fits the style. Real bass and guitar were appreciated and those guys were solid. The two front-men are charismatic enough but I'm not a fan of this style of rapping. I don't know what you call it. Loads of North East acts employ this mode of delivery. Just quite samey in terms of cadence. Some of the music was great but overall they were not my cup of Vimto.

However the audience really enjoyed all the acts, so what do I know? D.H

THE CHUCKLE BROTHERS TO YOU TO ME

You're probably aware of The Chuckle Brothers' foray into Grime in recent years (most notably their critically acclaimed collaboration with Tinchy Stryder) but you may not be so acquainted with their earlier, more experimental works.

'To You To Me' is the influential debut album by Rotherham duo The Chuckles.

Regarded by many critics as the stand out progressive dance album of 1995, it's a powerhouse of insightful and sometimes painfully introspective lyrics reinforced by intricate beats that go in extremely 'hard'. Whether pumping on the speakers in the club in the wee hours or through your headphones, home alone with a bag of veterinary grade Ketamine.

When Barry passed away in 2018, I, like everyone else from my generation, was rendered dumbfounded and in shock. I thought he would live forever.

Alas, it was a comfort to know that he (and Paul) had left behind such an extensive and varied body of music.



Little is known about the production phase of the album. This particular era in The Chuckles' timeline is acknowledged by fans as the 'twilight years' owing to their hard drug use around that time, which is very possibly why the album came out sounding so honest, raw, disorientating and psychedelic.

The opener 'Silly You, Silly Me' is a Country and Western tinged meditation on the confusion and futility of life, complete with a blistering guitar solo that leaves you questioning everything you once thought you knew about music.

Other gems include 'Dance With The Man' (rumoured to be a nod to pop impresario Dan the Van) a spoken word rave masterpiece (with a massive female lead chorus) that influenced everyone from Klaxons to LCD Soundsystem.

'Chu Chu Chucklevision' set the precedent in the mid 90's Trip-Hop scene. The brothers' bars on this one are next level. This joint is also notable for its impressive sax solo.

'Oi You' is a protest song about refusing to follow the crowd and becoming old before your years. The song's four to the floor 909 beat is the driving force behind The Chuckles' pertinent lyrical motifs. A call to arms for a generation of kids who just want to throw off the shackles and get off their heads on MDMA.

Although not one bit of this album could ever be described as 'throw away' the poppiest number has to be 'On The Beach' a song that implores the listener to believe anything is possible. It features a masterclass in sampling by Paul on the then cutting edge Akai S2000 sampler.

These songs are just a snap shot of the album as a whole, and if you are reading this then you are probably an avid music consumer, in which case you really should go out and buy this album off eBay or at the very least listen to it on YouTube. RIP Barry Elliot 1944 - 2018.

KRAFTWERK

RADIOACTIVITY AT 50





I first became properly acquainted with Kraftwerk at the tender age of 15. I'd heard a few of their hits, songs like 'The Model' and wanted to explore some more. I paid £5 for the CD from Music Zone in Queen Street, took it home, stuck it on my AIWA Hi-Fi system and never looked back. Futuristic yet nostalgic in character, Radioactivity is actually a bit of a psychedelic gem that will 'take your brain to another dimension'.

A concept work of sorts, addressing dual ideas of the FM radio (hence the Volksempfanger radio which was mass produced by the Third Reich in the 30's, an early masterpiece of modern Hi-Fi design). Another duality of the album is the crossover between English and German language. Kraftwerk's unofficial (and largely unsung) fifth member Emil Schult (who ironically did a lot more for the band than Wolfgang Flur or Karl Bartos ever did) previously spent time in the USA and as a result had a rather good grasp of English. Schult also wrote the lyrics for a myriad of other Kraftwerk hits as well as designing a slew of their album art (what a guy!!).

While many of the (by then awfully outdated) prog rock bands of the time were using the Mellotron, a large and expensive bit of kit that is regarded as an early sampler, Kraftwerk instead used the Vako Orchestron, a smaller and more versatile alternative to make polyphonic string and choir sounds. It's ubiquitous appearances on the album give' Radioactivity' its retro futuristic charm. New Order sampled the Orchestron intro from 'Uranium' for their 1983 song 'Blue Monday'.



This is the first of the Dusseldorf lads' albums to be fully electronic. By now the flute and vibraphone had all but disappeared from Kling-Klang studio, replaced by a core instrumental set up of Arp and Moog synthesisers, homemade drum machines, the previously mentioned Vako Orchestron and an early Sennheiser Vocader.

We are guided into the title track via way of Geiger Counter, an introductory piece utilising a bass drum sound to replicate the sound of a Geiger counter (which detects and measures radioactivity). 'Radioactivity' is a sentimental song, an ode to the FM radio frequency that many of us grew up with. It's the perfect pop track. A beautiful synergy of lyric and melody delivered with vocals that although aren't technically spectacular are nonetheless endearingly imperfect, touching and honest. 'Airwaves' is a definite nod to one of Kraftwerk's favourite bands The Beach Boys, complete with (obviously less accomplished) vocal harmonies and Theremin style synths which you can definitely liken to 'Good Vibrations'.


You experience a spectrum of musical feelings on your journey through the album, from the pseudo proto dubstep madness of' Antenna' to the romantic and earthly 'Ohm Sweet Ohm' featuring the ubiquitous Orchestron offering a nostalgic cello sound. You could actually believe 'Radioland' was an old time 1940's tune until the Vocoderised voice synth Emil Schult, Schult! makes its appearance.

Speaking of 'Antenna', this odd little exploration is years ahead of its time. Some big, mad synths and futuristic drums topped with really cool dual language lyrics and melody lines from Ralf Hutter. If you haven't heard this album before then LISTEN TO IT NOW!






