And the performers: myself, you know enough already, probably too much - possibly nothing.


But Robbie, Jezz and Paul must be acknowledged in their toughest of roles, writing, playing and enjoying a situation that some would only see as a poor alternative to other times on







## the players

### robbie blunt

#### **Guitars**

Data: Worcestershire-born Robbie Blunt started playing guitar when he was 13 and worked with several local blues trios before joining his first major band Bronco, with whom he cut two albums and toured America. Upon the demise of that band, he teamed up with Michael des Barres' Silverhead and subsequently he worked with Stan Webb, Little Acre, The Steve Gibbons Band and Weapons of Peace. In early 1981, he began working with Robert Plant in The Honeydrippers and has since played a very important part in the singer's solo career.

#### **Keyboards**

Data: After touring and recording with Black Sabbath during the mid-seventies, Jezz Woodroffe eventually decided that he'd had enough of rock'n roll and retreated to Birmingham where he started running the keyboard department in his brother's music store, which rapidly developed into an extremely healthy business concern. In the meantime, he continued to make solo records and provide music for TV and nature films. However, when Robert Plant came into the music shop one day, Jezz was invited down to Rockfield for some session work and he's now become an integral member of the Plant band.



#### **Bass Guitar**

Data: Paul Martinez, who plays bass on both 'Pictures At Eleven' and 'The Principles Of Moments', was born and raised in Leicester, where he served his musical apprenticeship gigging in various local bands. Originally a six-string guitarist, Paul switched to bass and in 1969 he moved down to London where he worked with Elmer Gantry. After that, There followed stints with Stretch, Paice Ashton Lord, John Otway, The Adverts and Stan Webb, and whilst working with the latter he played alongside guitarist Robbie Blunt, which was to lead to him being invited to work with Robert Plant.



#### **Drums**

Data: Ritchie Hayward was born in Des Moines, Iowa and joined his first group, The Factory, with Lowell George in 1966. He went on with Lowell to form Little Feat and played drums with that band for twelve years. He has played with some of the world's finest musicians including Al Kooper, Ry Cooder and Joan Armatrading and joins the band for the first time for the English tour.



#### **Guitars and Keyboards**


Data: A man of many talents, Bob Mayo has worked with a number of top acts over the past decade, including Foreigner, Aerosmith, Ian Hunter and Peter Frampton. Although he's not featured on either of the Robert Plant albums, Bob has been recruited to the live band to enhance the overall sound.

Cozy Powell and Barriemore Barlow

Although Phil Collins has provided the bulk of the drumming on Robert's albums, the contributions of Cozy Powell and Barriemore Barlow should not be ignored. Cozy, who plays on 'Slow Dancer' and 'Like I've Never Been Gone' from 'Pictures At Eleven', is now working with Whitesnake. Meanwhile, ex-Jethro Tull drummer Barrie Barlow, who is featured on 'Wreckless Love' and 'Stranger Here... than over there' on the current LP 'The Principles Of Moments', is currently playing with his own outfit Tandoori Cassette.




