Workshop Overview

As the federal Storage Tank Systems for Petroleum and Allied Petroleum Product Regulations were promulgated in 2008 (SOR 2008-197), a vast array of storage tank systems became subject to the application of this regulation under the Canadian Environmental Protection Act (1999). Provincial and municipal requirements also have been strengthened and made more stringent over the last 20 years. Storage tank system owners have been required to establish procedures and management programs to meet the stringent compliance requirements. The end goal is to protect the public, operators and the environment from releases related to storage tank systems. The public is all too aware of the considerably negative impacts product releases can have to their property, ground water and the environment as a whole. Storage tank owners are also keenly aware of the equally significant remediation and corrective action costs associated with product releases. The regulations and well publicized product releases have heightened the awareness of environmental issues for the public. Contaminated soil, sediment or groundwater as a result of hydrocarbon releases in prime real estate and sensitive ecological locations has resulted in the loss of millions of dollars due to lack of development or ineffective management of public real properties.

The presenters will provide attendees with access to a broad base of practical experience and an excellent opportunity to network with leading professionals. Important information regarding regulatory compliance aspects of contaminated site management will also be presented.

Regardless of your level of expertise, the combination of information presented during this workshop will benefit tank operators, managers and owners to provide attendees with the knowledge and confidence to effectively manage federal storage tank systems in a regulatory compliant manner.

The extent of more recent developments in the science and technology of storage tank systems and related petroleum equipment makes it difficult to gather up to date information on an on-going basis. The technical workshop will be the first of a regular series of workshops and outdoor demonstrations, designed for busy professionals.

This workshop provides an excellent synthesis of technical information and applied technology in storage tank systems and petroleum equipment.
