No proxy vote is allowed. **Regional Vice Presidents (RVP)** Voting will be done one position at a time starting from the Executive Vice 2. Zenaida D. Fletcher President who is the de-facto President-elect. Northwest USA Current Executive Vice President will assume the Presidency without election Violeta D. Cristobal Each candidate will be given three minutes to present his or her platform. 3. Southwest USA Dorothy V. Sweet An unsuccessful candidate can be nominated for another position. 4. Central USA 5. Any official delegate, or alternate delegate, may be nominated from the floor if Vivian F. Roz such nominee is a delegate of a *member in good standing*, has paid the \$10 Northeast USA election filing fee, and has pledged to attend the annual convention the next 2 years. Current Roberto Tamayo Executive Vice President assumes Presidency without election **Eligibility of Candidates**

1. Only official delegates designated as Electorate and Voting Delegates as described in Sections 3 and 5 of Article IX of a member chapter *in good standing, fully paid registered National Conference attendees,* and who have paid the \$10 election filing fee shall be considered eligible candidates to run for

Any official delegate or alternate may be nominated from the floor during the election if such nominee is a delegate of a member in good standing and has paid the \$10 election filing fee prior to the start of election. Art IX, Sec 4

- The candidates will be required to sign a pledge to attend the annual convention the next 2 years (2020 and 2021). Unexcused absence may be ground for removal from office by a vote of the remaining elected officers and chapter presidents, upon approval by the NCPACA President. Approved 9/21/02, Houston convention
- 3. The term *member in good standing* as used above shall refer to a member chapter of NCPACA that has paid all dues, assessments and obligations on time and participated in any activity of NCPACA. Art III, Sec 9
- All chapter members shall file an annual registration to be accompanied with a roster of official delegates described in Article V in the by-laws and annual dues within the first quarter of each calendar year. Art III, Sec 6

Electorate/Official Delegates

- 1. Only members described as official delegates in Article V, Section 2, shall vote during the election of officers. For purposes of voting during the election, each member chapter may revise their list of seven (7) delegates prior to the election. An official delegate shall be entitled to one vote. Art IX, Sec 3
- The official delegates shall be the following: (a) Seven (7) representatives from each member chapter, consisting of the incumbent chapter president and six (6) designated representatives; (b) current officers of NCPACA; and (c) Any former president of NCPACA. Art V, Sec 2
- **3.** Except for the 7 Regional Vice Presidents, the official delegates as described in Article V, Section 2 shall elect for the officers of NCPACA. **Art VII, Section 2**
- **4.** Starting with the 2013 convention, for the 2016-2017 term, each Regional VP shall be elected by

a) **Member chapter delegates** comprising each region in accordance with the rules and terms of office as provided for in the bylaws.

- b) Current officers of NCPACA from the region the Regional VP is voted upon
- c) **Any former presidents** of NCPACA from the region the Regional VP is voted upon.

- US Southeast Washington D C, West Virginia, Maryland, Delaware, Kentucky, Tennessee, North Carolina, Alabama, Georgia, South Carolina, Florida, Puerto Rico, Virginia
- Canada West British Columbia, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Yukon, Northwest Territories, Nunavut
- Canada East Ontario, Quebec, Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick. Nova Scotia, New Foundland and Labrador
- Members shall submit the names of their official delegates to the COMELEC no later than 14 days before the start of the convention. Only delegates submitted by the deadline can vote during the election of officers. Approved 9/21/02, Houston
- Members may submit by the same deadline the names of 7 alternate delegates. If an official delegate cannot attend the convention – not only the meeting – the member may appoint a replacement from the list of alternate delegates. Approved 9/21/02, Houston
- 7. Any changes to the status of delegates, must be submitted to the COMELEC no later than midnight of the first day of the convention.
