more guests often require starting before dinner. But for under 250 guests, let your guests enjoy the cake display throughout the dinner hour, then cut it immediately thereafter. A good compromise is to cut it as soon as the bride & groom are done eating, but some of the guests are still eating (again, this is for prep time reasons. It will ultimately depend upon the size of the staff at your chosen venue, so check with them to see what they are comfortable with.) You can also display a modest cake out front, but have additional cake in the kitchen. Is the cake being (please circle one): 1) served for dessert, 2) offered at the dessert or cookie table, 3) wrapped for take-home 4) given out during "money dance"? NOTE: This, and the previous question, are inter-related; if cake is being served for dessert, it will be need to be cut sooner than if it is being used in any of the other three manners. Consider your preferences and # of guestsand, as always, discuss with your venue/caterer.

Please also include parents' and grandparents' names if any of them will also be walking in with the bridal party. (Grandparents first, do they can sit down first, THEN parents. Then bridal party. OR we can acknowledge some or all parents/grandparents at their table if that is easier (for a wide variety of potential reasons including sticky divorce or re-marriage situations, handicaps & inability to walk, etc.) However, a wheelchair is NOT cause to keep them out of the fun and wheelchairs, crutches, etc, are always welcome in the lineup (they actually often get the biggest applause!) © .

Even if we will not be introducing them at all during this time, we will like to have their names just to be able to say hello to them by name, and already be prepared...and we especially need their names if we are announcing them and/or calling them up for the father-daughter, mother-son, and/or mother-daughter dances.

Lists of songs:

- 1. Must-have songs that you definitely WANT to hear for dinner or dance time.
 - You may submit 6-8 choices each, for the dinner and dance portions of your day.
 - Or, if you prefer, you can simply submit 15-16 dance songs instead, and we'll handle dinner. Or you can simply write down your favorite styles, or 15-20 favorite artists you like, if that is easier for you.
 - Choose a wide variety of songs or styles/artists that adequately summarize your dance music tastes, and we will gladly take it from there!
- 2. Please let us know which songs, artists/bands, and/or styles that you DO NOT want to hear on your special day, for any reason...(songs you dislike, songs reminding you of past relationships; divorced parents' wedding songs, songs related to someone who just died that might make everyone get very upset*, and other sensitive issues, etc.)
- 3. Please indicate if there are songs that you allow IF they are requested by your guests (oldies, line dances, etc.) (See the group dance list in the song ideas file.)

*However, if a song will be welcome as a fitting memorial to someone, that is at your discretion; you know your family situation better than anyone else. We are happy to play a dedication for you and send it out to their memory, if you wish. These memorials work well at dinnertime, or middinner, when everyone can hear it being announced /dedicated. Or, if the deceased had a special dance song that you want to play in their memory, and invite everyone up to dance to after dinner, that is fine as well! Your discretion.)

NOTE: If a good song is *unspecified, but falls under your <u>desired styles</u> of music, it is considered playable unless we are told <i>not* to play it. So if something is *definitely* a "do not play", *let us know!*

We will let the dance floor and the age/tastes of the guests be our guide, and we will read the crowd and play to them as the night unfolds. We share your goal of keeping everyone dancing!
