National Coordinating Centre Organized CRISM's annual meeting 2025 in Banff, Alberta

Here at the CRISM-IEP, we've been busy with planning and organizing for both the yearly IEP advisory meeting in September and the National CRISM leadership meeting in October.

During the NCC leadership meeting this past month, the CRISM lead researchers, node managers, and representatives from Health Canada, CIHR (Canadian Institute for Health Research) and community advocate and activist Dean Wilson, were present.

Conversations around node updates, platform establishment for clinical trials network, training, and national projects were unveiled and introduced. We also heard important updates from both Health Canada and CIHR for what is on the radar of government and our primary funding agency. We appreciated their time and input into the conversations as well as the willingness to listen to firsthand experiences, grassroot initiatives, and the realities of community-based research.



## Fall Advisory Council Meeting Highlights: Ottawa, Ontario





### Ottawa IEP Council Meeting

The CRISM-IEP gathering in Ottawa brought together representatives from all five CRISM nodes to share updates and strengthen cross-regional collaboration. Atlantic Node highlighted their work with Mi'kmaw Ethics Watch on community-led ethical guidance and a youth cannabis research initiative. Quebec Node shared progress on culturally safe care pathways and maternal health projects, while Ontario Node emphasized their involvement in the Sparrow Ascent Device trials and the potential of Thunderbird's research network. The Prairies Node celebrated a successful systems-level grant and introduced innovative programming like the Speakeasy podcast and micro-credit harm reduction courses. BC Node continues to seek Indigenous community support and shared resources like the FNHA and anti-racism toolkits.

Discussions also focused on the CIHR Cannabis team grant call and the IEP's role in shaping Indigenous-led research contributions. Elder Jo-Ann offered teachings on humility, ceremony, and protocol, and is preparing to host a Naming Ceremony in Elk Island this October.

Key action items include planning the Spring 2026 meeting in Montreal/Kahnawake, establishing working groups on Indigenous methodologies and researcher vetting, and expanding the IEP's evaluative toolkit with video content from node engagements. The CRISM-IEP website is now live, and the quarterly newsletter schedule has been set, with the next issue due in November. Members are encouraged to submit stories, resources, and edits to support ongoing knowledge sharing.

The meeting reinforced the importance of community-led research, ethical engagement, and intergenerational collaboration. With new funding, tools, and partnerships underway, CRISM-IEP continues to build a strong, culturally grounded network that supports Indigenous researchers and communities across Canada.
