School readiness means that children possess the necessary knowledge, behavior, and skills for a successful transition to kindergarten and for later learning.

2

Kindergarten transition begins 1 year before actually starting kindergarten.

3

Reading time does not have to be done consecutively. Reading 30 minutes in a day with your child will improve their language and literacy skills.

Children naturally have an inquisitive mind. When asking children questions, they must be given time to give a response.

5

Math is a part of our daily lives. Children can improve math skills if you talk to them about time, temperature, and money.

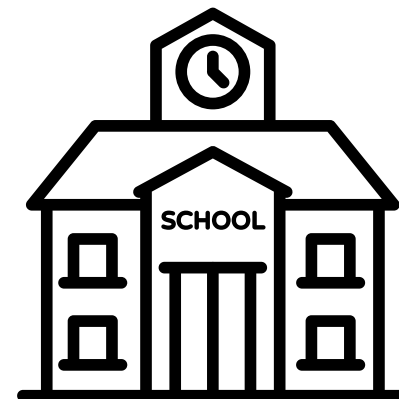

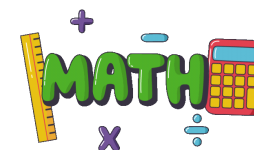

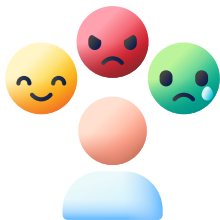
