Things you didn't know you needed to know...

We feel so lucky to have witnessed such a wide variety of weddings here at the farm. Over time, we've gathered a collection of (often wonderfully random) tips and ideas from couples that have created smooth, stress-free celebrations.

While we're not claiming to be experts, we'd love to share these little gems with you – because sometimes it's the smallest ideas that make the biggest difference.

Share Your Plan - Make your setup vision clear to everyone helping—print layouts, prep a sample table, and have a shared to-do list. It saves constant questions on the day!

Designate a Go-To Superstar - Have someone who knows the plan inside out. They'll handle supplier and venue questions so you can relax and enjoy your day.

Rehearse the Day Before - We highly recommend using your setup day for a ceremony rehearsal—your bridal party will likely be there anyway helping to set up, and it's great to practice with everything in place already to go!

Prepare for the Weather - Rain plans are essential, but don't forget wind! Think about how to secure lightweight items and décor—stone weights, taped fabrics, and sturdy tableware can make all the difference.

Golden Hour is a Myth! - It 's more like 'Golden 20 minutes!!' Let your photographer know if you want to capture photos during this time and avoid scheduling key events during that time—it's a quick window, but totally worth it!

Label Everything - Label your décor boxes clearly—include what's in them and where it goes. It'll make set-up much smoother and faster.

Keep Suppliers in the Loop - Ensure they know key details—venue address, access times, etc. We've made this easy with a ready-to-send supplier information document.

Plan for Allergies - Being on a farm means things like hay fever or bee allergies may come into play—consider packing antihistamines just in case.

Allow more time than you think you will need – If you have a 6 hour set up time, aim to be finished in 5 hours, giving you enough time to tackle any last-minute (hopefully small!) set up hiccups.

Plan your Pack Up – It's easy to overlook, but having a clear pack-up plan is just as important as setting up. If you won't be packing up yourselves, make sure you've nominated a few reliable people to help—and that they know exactly what needs to be done. Also, ensure your helpers have contact details for any suppliers—like if a cool room is scheduled for pickup the next day but no one arrives, who will follow that up?
