FLEET REPORT

Greetings from your Fleet Captain,

There has been much going on over the last couple of months and I am sure everyone is enjoying their summer. The club is continuing to transform, and progress has been made on our marina. It will be great to see it back and better than ever!

The weather is heating up and is both predictable and not, at the same time. You can almost set your clock to our midafternoon storms, and it's well known that Florida is the capital of lightning strikes. Just a quick reminder to check and update your hurricane storm plan for your boat. It's important to check your scuppers and bilge pumps to help keep your boat afloat. I have a few comprehensive boat check lists, if anyone needs one. As stated in the last Charlotte County Marine Advisory meeting, the starting cost to taxpayers to remove a sunken vessel is \$5,000. However, more often runs upwards of \$10-15,000 per vessel. Just one more reason to be prepared. The CCSO has a great presentation on derelict vessels and the process of removing them. I invited the sheriff to our club this next winter to present this great insight to our members. If anyone is interested in learning more, let me know.

Don't let the weather keep you off the water, however. Some of the best times on the water this time of year are the early mornings to beat the heat, or late evenings after the storms start to clear out. Just around the corner is our Punta Gorda 4th of July celebration. (June 29th and July 4th) Since both firework displays are over the water, what better place to watch them from our Clubs back yard or even up closer on a boat. Also don't forget about the Freedom swim happening the mid-morning on July 4th departing from Live Oak Point Park and ending at Fisherman's village.

Mark your calendar for some upcoming fun on the water. The Sandbar Music Festival is Saturday August 31st, off Dog Island at Boca Grand Sandbar. We are also doing our semi-annual Florida Keys trip August 24th to September 7th. This is a great opportunity to visit other FCYC Clubs. EIGHT BELLS



Sheldon Cole Rieley, 85, died peacefully on Friday, May 31 at the UVMMC. Shell was born February 8, 1939, in Cleveland Ohio to C. Sheldon Rieley and Katrine Charnley Rieley. He was raised in Elyria, Ohio, and graduated from Western Reserve Academy in Hudson, Ohio, in June 1957. During his time at Western Reserve, he made many life-long friends and was active in sports; he was a member of the soccer team, captain of swim team and member of All-America Prep School Swim Team.

Shell studied mechanical engineering at Cornell University, in Ithaca, New York, graduating in 1964 with a Master of Mechanical Engineering. While at Cornell, Shell met fellow student Penelope Byrne, and they married in June, 1961. In the summer of 1963, before his last year of college, Shell and Penny went to Europe, bought an Austin Healy Sprite sports car and had a lifetime experience traveling through Europe for the summer. Son Sheldon Scott arrived later that fall.

Shell and Penny's first home after leaving Ithaca, was in Charleston, West Virginia, where Shell worked for Dupont from January, 1964 to June, 1966. Their daughter Paige was born in Charleston in 1965. A position with IBM brought Shell and family to Burlington, Vermont, in July 1966, where their younger daughter Erin was born in 1967. At IBM, Shell worked in

development engineering and management for 26 years, retiring in August 1992. Boating was a lifelong passion that Shell inherited from his father. While at IBM, Shell was able to take a 6 month leave of absence, during which time his family boarded their 36' sailboat and spent the winter cruising the Caribbean to Grenada and back – a family adventure still remembered by all.

Shell was a 50+ year member of the First Congregational Church in Burlington, was active on church committees and enjoyed ushering on Sunday mornings. Shell joined Lake Champlain Yacht Club in 1973, remaining a life-long member, mooring a series of sailboats and powerboats there through the years. Their boats took Penny and Shell all around the eastern U.S., Canada and the Caribbean, completing the Great Loop and visiting most of the islands in the Caribbean. Shell and Penny spent countless summers cruising Lake Champlain with their yacht club friends. Shell was also the club's Vice Commodore for two years and received the Outstanding Yachtsman of the Year twice for contributions to the club. In 1984, after harboring an interest in rental real estate, Shell and son Scott bought their first rental apartment building on Buell Street in Burlington, Vermont. From that humble beginning, Shell and Scott built an ever-expanding real estate business in both residential and commercial properties. Shell has since retired from the business, while Scott remains at the helm.

Travel was a big part of the Shell and Penny's life. Upon Penny's retirement from the Vermont Health Department in 1992, they moved to St. Thomas in the US Virgin Islands for four years. Penny worked for the Territorial Government of the USVI, while Shell worked for an upscale marine store, meeting sailors from all over the world. They spent their free time sailing the US and British Virgin Islands. Later, traveling with their six grandchildren became an important part of their lives, and every summer they took them on trips to National Parks and overseas, creating memories with the younger generation.

Since 2000, Shell and Penny have made their winter home in Cape Haze, Placida, on the southwest coast of Florida. There they followed the steps of most old sailors and made the leap to powerboats. They joined the Charlotte Harbor Yacht Club in Port Charlotte, Florida, and enjoyed cruising Florida's waters with new friends.


Shell is survived by his wife, 3 children and their spouses and 6 grandchildren.


