While we sustained some measurable damage last year to the Club and the marina, it could have been so much worse. I say this knowing we still have some work to do partially finishing up the Pickleball courts and dredging the marina. There are still other Clubs within the FCYC that are in a full rebuild or continue to make the repairs and improvements to their facilities.

We remain grateful to our General Manager, staff and all the membership that volunteered to secure the Club and to help clean up from the damage during the 2024 Hurricane season. Having to re-install the

floating docks took a crane to accomplish along with divers and staff removing storm debris from our marina. It was disappointing to have just opened the marina before Debbie, Helene and Milton hit. A special thank you goes out to Tarpon Waterfront Village (President Jeffrey DiLaura) for their help and support with manpower and financial support. We continue to wait for our insurance coverage reimbursements.

As a reminder the Club has an EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS PLAN that we utilize in case of any emergency or storms that may affect us. Please see the Preliminary SLIP HOLDER ACTION CHECKLIST and BEFORE THE STORM check lists and our HURRICANE POLICY AND REGULATIONS later in the Depth Sounder.

I want to remind each of our Members that if you have a boat in the marina or on property you have a responsibility to secure, protect your property along with protecting the Club's property.

We will always do our best to provide you with as much information as possible about whether or when the Club would shut down or reopen in the event of any storm.

I would like to welcome our new Members from May: Brian Jeff Pearson, Scott Martin, Kathleen and Robert Davis and Ralph DeCesare who has served us as a Member of the BOD, Fleet Captain and as a Rear Commodore. Welcome or welcome back to you all. Please help our new Members feel welcome, please introduce yourself to our new Members and help them feel more welcome. We look forward to seeing you around the Club.

BOAT OWNERSSTORM AND HURRICANE SEASON

Preliminary SLIP HOLDER ACTION CHECKLIST

- 1. Know where all documentation and registration papers are located
- 2. Know where all warranty papers are located
- 3. Know where all insurance papers are located
 - a. Make sure policy is updated
 - b. Know what policy covers
 - c. Know your responsibility
 - d. Know your agent's responsibility
- 4. Know the Yacht Club rules and regulations
- 5. Know your responsibilities and liabilities for your boat and the Yacht Club
- 6. Obtain your hurricane equipment and supplies in advance of the season and store them
 - a. Correct Size dock lines for the size of boat
 - b. Chafing gear;
 - 1. Prepared hose
 - 2. Old rags, canvas or towels
 - 3. Duct tape and electrical tape
 - c. Fenders
 - d. Small line for lashing down, and cable ties
 - e. Any items that would help secure your vessel.

BEFORE THE STORM

Securing the Vessel:

- -Commence the Emergency Preparedness Plan 72 hours in advance
- -Top off all fuel tanks
- -Top off all freshwater tanks
- -Lower or remove all antennas
- -Remove sails and roller-furling
- -Lash down all that cannot be removed
- -Shut off seacocks
- -Check Batteries (water/level and charge)
- -Make sure bilge pumps are operable
- -Make sure all fire extinguishers are properly charged replace if necessary
- -Remove deck gear, dinghies, electronics and valuables (What vandals might remove)
- -Secure hatches, ports, lockers, etc...
- -Additional dock lines and chafing gear (Check with your Emergency Preparedness Team for the proper way of tying up your vessel)

(If you are using a cleat that is mounted on a pile the dock line is required to minimally be wrapped 1 time around the pile before securing the line to the cleat.)

- -Additional fenders
- -Remove all documentation, registration, warranty, insurance papers
- -Turn off all breakers except charger and bilge pumps
- -Disconnect, remove and stow electric and water lines (See Charger in #16)
- -For possible use during an emergency, remove and keep near your person
 - a. PFD(s)
 - b. Foul weather gear
 - c. Knife sharp
 - d. Spare lines
 - e. Chafing gear

*The EPT (Emergency Preparedness Team) may be required to turn water and electrical service off to the docks within 24 hours from the storms ETA.

DO NOT STAY ABOARD YOUR VESSEL DURING A STORM

Charlotte Harbor Yacht Club HURRICANE POLICY AND REGULATIONS

During hurricanes and other high velocity wind events each member shall be responsible for following all safety precautions that may be issued or recommended by the National Hurricane Center, National Weather Service, U.S. Coast Guard, the Club or any other applicable agency. If a member's vessel sinks as a result of a storm or for any other reason, the Member must remove the sunken vessel from the Club immediately after the occurrence of such event and if not so removed within twenty-four hours after the sinking, the Club may (but shall not be obligated to) remove the sunken vessel and charge such cost of such removal to the Member. Each Member agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Club, its directors, officers, representatives, agents and employees for and from any and all loss or damage incurred in connection with the exercise or non-exercise of the Club's rights hereunder, unless such loss or damage is proximately caused by any of the aforesaid parties' gross negligence or willful misconduct.

If a Member plans to be absent during the hurricane season such Member must prepare their wet/dry slip and secure or remove, as appropriate, their vessel prior to his departure in accordance with the standards established by the Board of Directors or the Club (or in the absence thereof with all due care), designate a responsible firm or individual to care for their wet/dry slip and vessel should there be a hurricane or other storm and furnish the Club with the name(s), address and telephone number of such firm or individual shall be subject to the approval of the Club.

The Member shall be liable for any and all damages caused to the Club property or to the wet/dry slip(s), vessel(s), or other property of other Members for such Member's improper preparations of their vessel or wet/dry slip for hurricanes and other storms. Notwithstanding anything contained herein to the contrary, the Club may also levy fines if the Member fails to abide by the provisions or this paragraph. Notwithstanding the right of the Club to enforce the foregoing requirements, the Club shall not be liable to any Member or other person or entity for any damage to persons or property caused by a member's failure to comply with such requirements.

Members who wet/dry slip renters must always maintain insurance for their boats with amounts and types of coverage satisfactory to the Board of Directors of the Club. All copies of all such policies shall be delivered to the Club.

Once the Weather Bureau has issued a Hurricane Watch (hurricane may threaten within 36 hours), the marina will be closed to all boats.







<u>Casual-Casual:</u> Designated areas are the Ships Wheel and the Outside Deck the designated areas for men and women to wear athletic clothing to include, but not limited to, sport clothing, T-shirts and shorts. The Ships Wheel will permit this type of dress between the hours of 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Saturday. The Outside Deck will permit this type of dress from the Club opening until Club closing, unless there is a private function being held using the outside deck.
