Meet A CHYC MEMBER

DOUG FOSTER

Doug Foster was born in Attleboro, Massachusetts and lived there most of his life. Attleboro is located just north of Rhode Island and the beautiful coastal scenery. After high school Doug joined his father and grandfather in the family heating oil business. When the company was bought by the largest heating oil company in R.I. in 1977. Doug spent the rest of his career in Providence RI. He told me how the local family Company eventually was bought out by one of the largest heating oil conglomerates in the US. In 1994 he was able to continue his heating oil career. He discussed with me his love for number crunching which began early in his life. This for certain made him a valuable Managerial executive and he was able to enjoy the work of fine tuning the business until retirement in 2008. He was proud of the accomplishments his Grandfather and Father were able to devote their lives to the earlier transitional years of oil heating and following in their footsteps.

Doug explained he was out riding around in his car and happened upon the Charlotte Harbor Yacht Club. By this time he had been through the loss of his wife and was anxious to meet new friends. He became a member on his first visit. "I enjoy most days of sitting outside with a good cigar and take in one of the most beautiful views in Charlotte County. I'm usually joined by a few other members with the exact same celebration of retirement."

The comradeship of the club has offered exceptional opportunities for good conversation and conviviality with an excellent aromatic cigar to appreciate life in the moment. I considered a reflective Groucho Marx moment while conversing with Doug. For me, an epiphany consensus evolved on the true romance he had with a good cigar. Doug stated that he had wished he found this contentment before the days he struggled through his wife's illness. He added that he was able to volunteer his abilities as Treasurer for some years and felt more than a little attached to all the complex changes that created a new approach to

ownership. "I support the current visionary concepts that will create a stronger Yacht Club here in Port Charlotte. The view of the harbor is calming and relaxing and I will never take a complacent attitude on how fortunate I am at this time in my life." Doug spoke about his two children that now have a total of three children which makes Doug a proud Grandad and are all college age. "Every Sunday we enjoy 'FaceTime' on the phone."

Doug has a new significant partner who joins him for conversation, cocktails and dining at the club with the many friends he met over past years. He also complimented new members and their collective energy for tasks that hope to make the club as H. G. Wells remarked, "The shape of things to come"!

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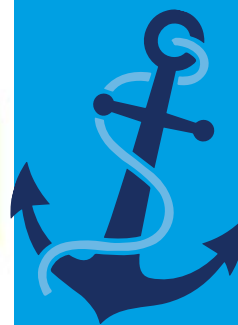

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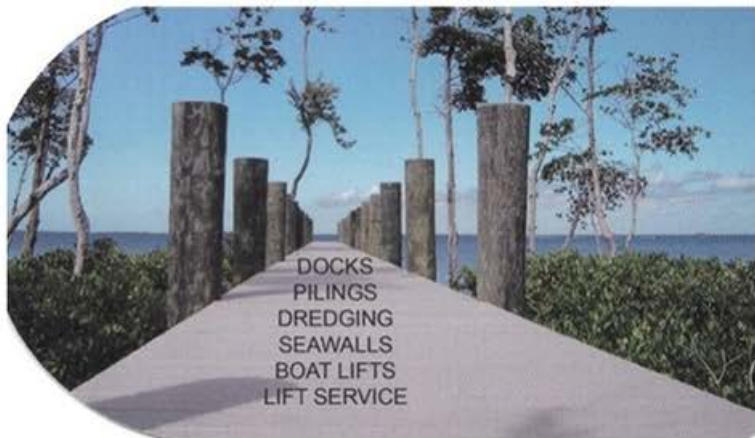

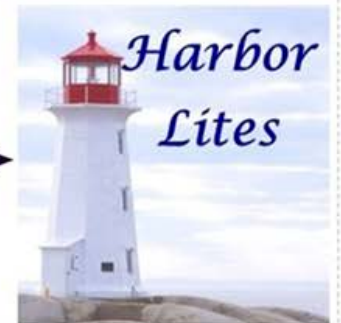

DRESS CODE DEFINITIONS

Jacket Required: Gentlemen wear suits or sports coat and trousers, dress shirt and tie (optional), turtleneck or dressy collarless shirt with sleeves. Ladies wear dresses or suits, long or short skirts, or dressy slacks and tops.

Casual: Gentlemen wear dressy slacks, collared shirt, turtleneck or dressy collarless shirt with sleeves. Ladies wear skirts, dressy slacks and tops. For Gentlemen and Ladies, no shorts, no torn or cutoff clothing. Dress denim is allowed.

Shorts Permitted: Gentlemen wear dressy slacks or appropriate length shorts, collared shirt, turtleneck or dressy collarless shirt with sleeves. Ladies wear skirts, dressy slacks or dressy shorts and tops. For Gentlemen and Ladies, no T-shirts, torn or cutoff clothing. Upscale denim is allowed.

Casual-Casual: Designated areas are the Ships Wheel and the Outside Deck the designated areas for men and women to wear athletic clothing to include, but not limited to, sport clothing, T-shirts and shorts. The Ships Wheel will permit this type of dress between the hours of 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Saturday. The Outside Deck will permit this type of dress from the Club opening until Club closing, unless there is a private function being held using the outside deck.

Please note: T-shirts are never permitted in the dining room.
