Last month we had our semi-annual Florida Keys trip. This time we visited Marathon Yacht Club, St Charles Yacht Club and Captive Yacht Club. While the weather was a bit hit or miss overall it was a great time. We invite you all to join us next spring as we do it again!

September marks the tail end of summer and the beginning of our fall boating season here on Charlotte Harbor. While hurricane season keeps us all on alert, this month also brings some of the most rewarding cruising weather when the storms stay away — cooler mornings, lighter crowds on the water, and steady breezes perfect for sailing.

Here's what's happening around the harbor and within our fleet this month:

† On the Water Hot Spots

- **Peace River Upstream Runs** Early fall mornings are ideal for a calm motor or sail upriver. Wildlife sightings are abundant this time of year, especially ospreys and manatees.
- Pelican Bay at Cayo Costa Still a favorite anchorage as summer winds down. If you go midweek, you'll find plenty of room to spread out and enjoy a peaceful night at anchor.
- **Boca Grande Pass** Great fishing waters as the fall migration begins. Anglers in the fleet are already reporting early-season redfish and snook action along the passes and flats.

We'll be heading over to Captiva Yacht Club for Labor Day weekend. Dock availability is limited but there are also great spots to anchor near Pelican Bay. 





Equipment to Carry

Certain items are required by Florida Law depending on the Class of your vessel. Please refer to the proper guidelines to make sure your boat is equipped with the necessary equipment.



Personal Floatation Device

Must carry one Type I, II or III for each person on board.



Toolbox with Needed Tools

It's a good idea to carry any tools needed for basic repairs.



First Aid Kit

Just having this is not enough. Be sure to know how to use its contents.



Throwable Floatation Device

A Type IV floatation device is recommended on vessels.



Fire Extinguishers

Refer to your boat class to determine which types to carry.



Dry Box

Easily keep sensitive items safe from exposure.



Sound Producing Device

Make sure that it can be heard from a good distance.



Radio

Being able to communicate with the USCG can save lives.



Registration/Paperwork

Keep all of your important paperwork handy just in case.



Visual Distress Signal

It is important to carry signals that work in both day and night.



GPS Locator

This can be used in a variety of ways including helping rescue find you faster.



Charts

This is especially important when going to new areas.



Shorts Permitted: Gentlemen wear dressy slacks or appropriate length shorts, collared shirt, turtleneck or dressy collarless shirt with sleeves. Ladies wear skirts, dressy slacks or dressy shorts and tops. For Gentlemen and Ladies, no T-shirts, torn or cutoff clothing. Upscale denim is allowed.

<u>Casual-Casual:</u> Designated areas are the Ships Wheel and the Outside Deck the designated areas for men and women to wear athletic clothing to include, but not limited to, sport clothing, T-shirts and shorts. The Ships Wheel will permit this type of dress between the hours of 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Saturday. The Outside Deck will permit this type of dress from the Club opening until Club closing, unless there is a private function being held using the outside deck.
