**April Guest Speaker: Capt Corey A. Braddock  
 Commanding Officer**

Captain Corey Braddock, Commanding Officer of US Coast Guard (CG) Base Alameda, is a 29-year veteran of the US military—21 years with the CG and eight with the Army. Prior to his assignment to Base Alameda, Corey stood up the Operational Logistics Command’s (LOGCOM) Expeditionary Logistics Division (LOG-X) delivering “last mile” mission support services that facilitated global military operations. Operationally, Corey served as the Executive Officer of CG Air Station San Francisco, overseeing search and rescue, law enforcement, and emergency response for 80% of California’s coastline and three of the nation’s busiest maritime ports. He also served as an Aeronautical Engineering Officer for both Air Station Detroit, MI and the Helicopter Interdiction Tactical Squadron (HITRON) in Jacksonville, FL. In both assignments he served as a helicopter instructor pilot, flight examiner, and lead maintenance test pilot. Before HITRON, Corey served as a search & rescue pilot and collateral duty officer at Air Station Savannah, GA. As a staff officer, Corey served at CG Headquarters in the Office of Budget and

Programs (CG-821) where he oversaw personnel & human resources portfolio; and the CG's an account that made up 60% of the Service's \$12 billion budget. Preceding his Coast Guard service, Corey served in the United States Army. In the Republic of Korea, he was a lead operational planner for a 2,500-soldier aviation brigade and the Commanding Officer for a UH-60 Blackhawk helicopter company. Stateside, he trained National Guard and Reserve units for combat operations, led an aviation platoon, and acted as the Executive Officer for a headquarters company.



Corey earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics from the United States Military Academy at West Point, NY; a Master of Business Administration degree from American Public University; and a Master of Public Administration degree from Harvard University's John F. Kennedy School of Government. He also served as a National Security Affairs Fellow at the Hoover Institution, Stanford University and as a Fellow at the Center for Homeland Defense and Security's Executive Leadership Program. Corey is a Department of Homeland Security Certified Acquisition Professional and holds a rating as a Federal Aviation Administration Rotorcraft Commercial & Airline Transport Pilot.

Corey is married and has four children. His wife, Dr. Jennifer Braddock holds a Doctor of Philosophy degree in Mass Communication and is a lecturer at Santa Clara University and the Director of Product Delivery at the National Society of Leadership and Success.

Remember to claim your California income exclusion on your 2025 tax return 540 CA, part 1, line 5. *If you received retirement pay from the federal government for service in the uniformed services or annuity payments pursuant to a United States Department of Defense Survivor Benefit Plan during the taxable year, and you included all or part of these payments in taxable income in column A, enter the taxable payment amount in column B, not to exceed \$20,000.*

### Women’s History Month

#### *History*

Women’s History Month is a dedicated month to reflect on the often-overlooked contributions of women to U.S. history. From [Abigail Adams](#) to [Susan B. Anthony](#), [Sojourner Truth](#) to [Rosa Parks](#), the [timeline of women’s history milestones](#) stretches back to the founding of the United States.

The actual celebration of [Women's History Month](#) grew out of a weeklong celebration of women's contributions to culture, history and society organized by the school district of Sonoma, [California](#), in 1978. Presentations were given at dozens of schools, hundreds of students participated in a "Real Woman" essay contest and a parade was held in downtown Santa Rosa.

A few years later, the idea caught on within communities, school districts and organizations across the country. In 1980, President [Jimmy Carter](#) issued the first presidential proclamation declaring the week of March 8 as National Women's History Week. The U.S. Congress followed suit the next year, passing a resolution establishing a national celebration. Six years later, the National Women's History Project successfully petitioned Congress to expand the event to the entire month of March

### Preparing for Tax Season

This month's column will continue the discussion from last month on tax filing for 2025. Please note that this column is not intended to provide individual tax guidance, and I always suggest that if you have a question about your taxes, reach out to a tax professional sooner rather than later as mistakes on your tax returns can cost you a lot of money.

Many of the changes under OBBBA are in effect for tax years 2025 through 2028. Among them are:

**Standard deductions:** The standard deduction has increased to \$15,750 for single filers or married couples filing separately; \$23,625 for single heads of households with dependents; and \$31,500 for married couples filing jointly.

**Deduction for seniors:** Those who are age 65 and older may claim an extra deduction of \$6,000, or \$12,000 for a married couple where both spouses qualify. The deduction phases out for taxpayers with

modified AGI over \$75,000 and joint filers over \$150,000. Your Social Security may be taxable, depending on your total income and filing status.

**New car loans:** Interest is tax deductible on car loans used to buy a new vehicle, as of Jan. 1, 2025. It must be for personal use, and the final assembly must have been in the United States. The maximum annual deduction is \$10,000. The deduction phases out for single filers with modified adjusted gross income over \$100,000 and joint filers over \$200,000.

**SALT deductions:** The deduction allowed for state and local income taxes, property taxes and real estate taxes has increased from \$10,000 to \$40,000 for most taxpayers.

**Mortgage interest:** The mortgage interest deduction is still capped at \$750,000 of indebtedness, and the law makes that permanent. This amount won't increase in future years because of inflation.

**Earned Income Tax Credit:** You may qualify for the EITC even if you can't claim children on your tax return. The credit could reduce the amount of taxes owed or increase your refund. For example, for tax year 2025, a married couple filing jointly with three qualified children, with a maximum adjusted gross income of \$68,675 might qualify for a credit of up to \$8,046. There are special EITC rules and considerations for military members who receive nontaxable combat pay.

**Child and dependent credits:** The [child tax credit](#) is up to \$2,200 per child under age 17 at the end of 2025. It's phased out for single filers starting at \$200,000 and for joint filers at \$400,000, so it will apply to most of the military population, Mitchell said. To qualify this year, at least one parent and the child must have a valid Social Security number.

## Happy St. Patrick's Day and AiA Updates

I hope that you had a fun St Patrick's Day complete with wearing the green, corned beef and cabbage and a little luck to fill your pot of gold! March has certainly been playing tricks on us...we have winter storms and now followed by a March heat wave! I hope that you stay indoors during this heat and make sure to hydrate and if you go out, please be sure to wear sunscreen!

**Advocacy in Action** is about a month away and information on our focus areas have been revealed. Focus areas are:

1. The [GUARD VA Benefits Act](#): Protect Veterans from Claim Sharks (H.R.1732). California recently passed its version SB 694 that was signed by Gov. Newsome. This needs to be addressed on the federal level as well. <https://moaa.quorum.us/campaign/154789/>
2. [Shutdown Fairness Act](#): Ensure Servicemembers Receive Pay and Benefits. Passing this legislation would ensure that members of the armed services continue to receive their pay and benefits during a government shutdown. As we are continuing to see this happen, this is very important. <https://moaa.quorum.us/campaign/142300/>
3. [Major Richard Star Act](#): End the Unjust Pay Offset for Combat-Injured Veterans. Veterans with less than 20 yrs of service who were medically retired lose part of their earned military retirement

for every dollar they receive in VA disability compensation. This legislation would correct a long-standing oversight. <https://moaa.quorum.us/campaign/121141/>

4. **Military CARE Act:** Improve Access to Care at Military Hospitals and Clinics. Military treatment facilities (MTFs) are a critical part of the military health system, but access-to-care challenges continue to prevent many servicemembers and their families from receiving timely, service-earned medical care. Shortages of appointments and referral delays remain common problems. We are asking that the CARE Act (H.R.6796) be passed to help our military members and their families receive these services that are essential to everyone. <https://moaa.quorum.us/campaign/151857/>

Please contact your local legislators and ask that they support these pieces of legislation and help improve the services that our active duty, retirees, veterans and their families deserve.

Forty-two are LIFE members and seventeen are Premium members at the national level. Fourteen (including 3 Active-Duty Members) of our Chapter members are “Basic” members of MOAA at the national level. MOAA is encouraging all “Basic” members to become either “Premium” or “LIFE” members, i.e., dues paying members.

It is important that Chapter members who are Premium (Annual) members of national MOAA keep their national MOAA membership current with the payment of annual dues; or upgrade to “LIFE” membership in national MOAA.

**Life Membership:** LIFE membership costs vary from \$921 for someone 49 years old or less to \$107 if you are 95 to 99 years old. If you are over 100, LIFE Membership is FREE. LIFE membership passes to your spouse if you predecease your spouse.
