Upon The Rock

From this small sampling of our past, there can be no question that our Founding Fathers understood the virtues of the Christian faith. It is also quite evident that our laws and civil structure are inseparably built upon the solid rock of Christian prin-

ciples. In fact, even Newsweek reported in its December, 1982 issue that "...historians are discovering that the Bible, perhaps even more than the Constitution is our Founding document."

This founding has given America unprecedented political and civil prosperity for over 200 years. But something very alarming has happened, perhaps only in the last 30 years, that today is reaping great destruction of the heritage God has given us. It has led us to a place where teen pregnancy, abortion, violent crimes, drug abuse, divorce and sexually transmitted diseases daily touch our lives in some way. What has happened in America?

On Sinking Sand!

Perhaps we already know what has happened to America. But to be sure, let's look at a quote that sums it up pretty well. Dr Dobson, respected Christian psychologist and author, in his newest book Children At Risk writes:

"Nothing short of a Civil War of Values is being fought today throughout North America. Two sides with vastly different views...are locked in a bitter conflict that permeates every level of society...the struggle now is for the hearts and minds of the people. It is a war over ideas. .. 30 years ago, biblically based concepts were the dominant values and beliefs in Western society...the humanistic system of values has now become the predominant way of thinking in most of the power centers of society. It has outstripped Judeo-Christian precepts in the universities, in the news media, in the entertainment industry, in the judiciary, in the federal bureaucracy, in business, medicine, law, psychology and sociology, in the arts, in many public schools, and to be sure, in the halls of Congress."

"Is The LORD'S Arm Too Short?" (Num 11:23)

You can be sure that we have lost much ground in the battles to hold onto America's heritage. But CAM believes that the Lord's arm has not grown short and that in Him we can still win the war. God is calling a great multitude from His church, but we cannot win this war if we don't join in unity as the body of Christ and WORK TOGETHER. Dr. Dobson shares this vision:

"The great army of believers could still turn the tide of battle if it awakens in time, but thus far, only a courageous minority has been willing to defend the beloved homeland with their lives."

We are all called by God to be the "salt" and "light" of Christ in our communities and that is what we Christians must be. We have got to "let our light shine" and get involved at every level of society. Only then can the salt of Christ flavor the world through us.

Our Beginnings

In Vermont, God has sent out the call for soldiers in all denominations of the Christian community to reclaim our homeland. In 1990, God led many of these believers together and we discovered the common burden for our state. We recognized the need to network together and share information in a timely fashion, to share our insights, to unite in prayer and coordinate together in good works for God's glory. We also recognized the need to be a resource and not a burden to our church "shepherds", who cannot be all things for all people, and to respect their God given authority and duty. Also, we had to overcome denominational barriers and respect the differences in the way we worship our Lord. God gave us all a free conscience and that had to be considered.

We knew we wouldn't all agree on all things, but we had to agree that God has the answer for the needs of our country and that He has the ability to reach the


world with that message through us. Thus the Christian Action Ministry was formed.

Who We Are

We are simply a group of lay leaders from many different churches in our community who work under the authority of our pastors. We meet together monthly to seek God as to the practical and effective ways we can be Christ's Salt and Light in our local, state and national communities. Currently, there are about 12 participating churches from the Chittenden County area. Our mission is to be an educational resource and stimulus for united Christian involvement. We have all seen the fruit from recent "concerts" of effort by the Christian community through prayer and in bringing the message of hope, in Christ, to a hurting world. What We Do

The lay leaders from each partic ing church are encouraged to build a L. A within their home body which meets monthly to facilitate involvement and to be an educational resource for that body. They provide a two-way communication channel between the local church and its leadership, and the network group. CAM works hand-in-hand with the many Judeo-Christian organizations already on the battlefront of Vermont in order to be as efficient as possible for God's glory. Our educational resources include a periodic newsletter, a calendar of local events, fact papers and a resource kit which includes a reading list and a list of names, addresses and phone numbers of interest. We also sponsor seminars, workshops, book studies and educational trips to Montpelier.

The network group forms study committees that explore important issues and alternatives for action. These in turn present recommendations to the group for discussion. Once CAM has done its work, the liaison or liaison team reports bac their pastors, and if appropriate, the ward body. Whenever possible, CAM will work toward united action from the church community, but each church acts at their own discretion.
