he BDS movement is a global campaign to increase economic and political pressure on Israel to comply with the stated goals of the movement: their wish to end Israel's occupation of the West Bank and the Golan. This campaign is organized, coordinated, and sponsored by the Palestinian BDS National Committee. The campaign was started in July 2005 with over 170 Palestinian NGOs in support of the Palestinian cause for boycott, divestment and international sanctions against Israel. (1)

Many countries, corporations, unions and various other organizations worldwide have opted to boycott trade with Israel on the grounds of human rights violations. These include, but are not limited to corporations within the United States, United Kingdom, Canada, and the European Union. In addition, the World Council of Churches, the Church of England, the British Methodist Church, the United Church of Canada, and the general assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) have also decided to support the BDS

movement.

Many Israeli corporations have been targeted, with unfortunate consequences for the Palestinians of the West Bank who are being negatively impacted. Responding to international boycott pressures and other constraints, a growing number of Israeli companies operating in the Region are moving their facilities to locations within Israel's internationally recognized borders.



The report by Gush Shalom, an anti-occupation organization that monitors such activities, shows that aside from the recent high-profile cases of Ahava (Dead Sea skin care) and SodaStream (a seltzer machine manufacturer), other prominent Israeli companies have also been part of the trend, even though they have

managed to evade publicity. Among them, Teva Pharmaceuticals (a leading producer of generic drugs), Adanim Tea, Modan Bags, and Delta Galil (works with Nike, Target, Tommy Hillfiger), a major clothing exporter. These companies rely heavily on export markets. (2)

So...when 500 Palestinians lose their jobs at SodaStream, they are left with little option but to find work at the Palestinian minimum wage, which in 2014 was \$410 a month; Israel's minimum wage was \$1,217. The Israeli Supreme Court decision in 2007, requiring Palestinians to receive the same salaries and benefits as Israelis, has ensured better working and living conditions for those employed by Israeli companies. A Palestinian employee at SodaStream was quoted 'these people are fighting against my right to work. You're not going to get peace through boycotts. You're not going to get peace through pressure. You get peace through working together.' (3)

So, if the goal of the campaign is to undermine the wellbeing and livelihood of Palestinians living in the West Bank, they have met with some success. Daily, there are about 90,000 Palestinians who cross into Israel for employment. Imagine their lives if Israel would boycott their livelihood.

Another devious element of the system of racial segregation BDS policy is the call for a cultural boycott against Israel. It aims to negatively impact Israel's image and to exclude it from International cultural activities. It harms individual Israeli artists, moviemakers, and performers who are boycotted by those who claim to policies. The performance by American Jewish artist Matisyahu was initially cancelled at a reggae music festival in Spain as part of an effort to boycott Israel. Festival organizers announced they had canceled Matisyahu's performance Jewish teachers teaching in after he refused to sign a statement endorsing a Palestinian state. A different scenario was the cancellation of a scheduled performance by Black artist Lauryn Hill at Richon Letzion. BDS promoters claimed that performing in Israel today is the equivalent of participating in Sun City, South Africa during the apartheid era.

The allegation that Israel is an apartheid state is untrue and pure slander. It is intended to delegitimize Israel's existence in the eyes of those who may

not be familiar with the South Africa of the early Nelson Mandela days. Mandela was fighting for the right to vote, for the right to choose political leaders, for the right to move and travel freely, for the right to be educated, and to get medical treatment in a hospital of one's choice.

Those who suffered under that and have been to Israel will be quick to deny that Israel is such a country. In fact, some, such as Kenneth Meshoe, a member of the South African parliament and President of the African Christian Democratic Party, feel that by comparing the two, one is imposing an injusonly oppose Israeli government tice on the pain blacks had suffered. He states that if the conditions in South Africa had been as they exist in Israel, there would have been no need for an arms struggle. (4) There are Arab judges in the Israeli High Court; there are non-Israeli schools, there are 17 Arab members of the Israeli Knesset, and hospitals do not discriminate.

> The goal should be to expose the truth and facts about Israel before the lies and conspiracy theories infiltrate. The longterm impact of this movement is threatening for Israel and in fact for the world. Today's university students are the leaders of tomorrow. We need to strengthen their understanding on campus and educate those who are open to hearing

about Israel. It is critical to reach out to those who are neither pro- nor anti-Israel to educate them that Israel is a democratic, moral, progressive, and tolerant nation. In addition to the 1.5 million Arabs living in Israel, the country has absorbed over 120,000 black refugees from Ethiopia, and 75,000 people from India.

"The goal is to expose the BDS movement as the latest platform for delivering anti-Semitism," Laurie Cardoza-Moore, president and founder of The Christian Zionist organization Proclaiming Justice to the Nations (PJTN), told Tazpit Press Service (TPS).

"Unfortunately, the Evangelical Christians are now being targeted by the propagandists and anti-Semites who are accusing Israel of violating Palestinian rights," she claimed. "And the narrative coming out of the Palestinian Authority, as well as from Palestinian Christians like 'Christ at the Checkpoint,' or the Bethlehem Bible College, is that Jesus had more in common with the Palestinians. Some go as far as to say that Jesus was a Palestinian and that he was not Jewish." "We're trying to combat their narrative because they are targeting the Evangelical Chris-

tian community saying, 'You should be standing with your Christian Palestinian brethren and supporting us because we're being persecuted,"" Cardoza-Moore explained. "So it's very important that we communicate the true narrative to the Evangelical communi-

This claim of Israeli apartheid is totally counterintuitive to the promotion of peace and harmony in the Middle East. In fact, it acts a disincentive to peace. It sends a powerful message to the PLO and Hamas leaders that they can wait to get a better settlement if or when BDS gains strength and the sanctions make an impact on Israel.

BDS is an immoral movement that ought to be condemned. It is part of a generalized effort to destroy Israel. It has embezzled the moral high ground from Israel and turned it into a debate about the legitimacy of the State of Israel. Many Israelis believe that the true aim of BDS is to undermine the very existence of Israel with little regard for the welfare of the Palestinians. Since such an acknowledgement by the National Committee would represent political suicide, their tacit agenda is to take over the land from the Jordan River to the Mediterranean Sea and create a Palestinian one state solution.
