which the Christian Action Ministry has taken a survey of the candidates' positions on issues of interest to Christians. We are taking a different approach this year and only publishing results for the candidates that replied. There are several reasons for this. The response to our survey was the lowest of all the 13 surveys we have done, perhaps due to the large number of non-contested races (why reply if you are the only one running). The major parties discourage the candidates from answering surveys, and we had only a few people willing to help out with candidate follow-up and reviewing other sources for answers (which takes the most effort).

We broke our questions into four sections to mirror the Declaration of Independence and labeled them Unalienable Rights, Life, Liberty, and Pursuit of Happiness. Many of the questions would not be asked of the candidates in the normal forums sponsored by various groups. The questions we asked were also geared to determining a candidate's character. How someone stands on an issue, even if it may not come to a vote, can tell you a lot about how they might react to other issues not yet introduced.

We started questions with a key word, usually SUPPORT or OPPOSE, to clarify the intent of each question and allow a "yes" or "no" answer. If the response contained comments that made the answer unclear, it was marked as "undecided".

The next step in the survey was to determine who to contact. The 2016 questionnaire polled candidates for Governor and Lt. Governor; also the

Vermont House and Senate from Chittenden, Franklin, Rutland, and Grand Isle counties.

Not all candidates answered. Some never answer questionnaires. Others don't wish you to know their positions (particularly if they are not favorably inclined to a Christian perspective). We attempted to make up for this by return calls to candidates who have answered in previous surveys.

The final step is setting up a format to display the answers, and entering the information as it is received. We hope you will closely review the survey and make an informed decision on November 8th.

Voting Tips

s we get ready to vote on November 8th - I am assuming you all will take your responsibility to be salt and light on election day seriously - here are a few things to consider. I use the word he, but always include she in talking about the candidates, and use good and bad only to say the candidate agrees with you on the issues.

For state and local elections most of us will have choices that say vote for no more than two or four or six. It is important to get rid of our old high school mind-set that said with multiple choice questions you guess if you don't know blank is wrong for sure. Not so didn't vote for him. Perhaps with voting. In the simplest example, if it is a vote for no more than two and there is one you like but you also vote for another one just because you don't want to leave it blank that one vote for the bad candidate added in to the total votes might just be the one vote that makes him win over the good candidate. Not voting for the maximum allowed is what is

called **bullet voting** and it is a powerful tool and often ignored. Feel free to leave blanks!

The other factor that comes into play with leaving blanks is, if there are 100 voters and the candidate gets only 60, he



maybe you'll get it right - but a has to wonder why the other 40 more importantly in two or four years when a potential good candidate is looking at the numbers and considering a run for office, if he sees in the last election his potential opponent got only 60 of 100, he might be more willing to jump into the race.

> One of the toughest things about voting can be the ques

tion of voting the lesser of evils. What do you do when you don't really like either choice, or any of the choices? We each have to examine our conscience in those cases, but I think one thing that makes it easier is to take a close look at the moral issues which should always carry more weight than the other factors. Things like abortion, the sanctity of the traditional family, the protection of the church, our Christian values and constitutional rights, are issues that outweigh the candidate that might give us a free telephone. Not voting can result in basically giving your vote to the opposition. So in the cases where there is a clear difference in something like protecting life, the family, or our Constitution, personally, I think there is a responsibility to vote for that candidate that will stand for the moral values we know are important and we see eroding in our society. Again, personally, I don't see how anyone who claims to be a Bible believing Christian, can vote for a candidate who promotes abortion, homosexuality, the silencing of our Churches, or the denial of our Country's

Christian heritage and Christian founding principles. What could that candidate possibly offer that is more important?

There is probably only one person who would agree with you always and that is you and you're not running. Why? Probably because it's too hard and a huge sacrifice. So recognize that and support those who are willing to make the sacrifice, are close to your beliefs, and firm on the moral issues. Take the time to go vote for them, endorse them to your family and friends, put up a lawn sign or bumper sticker, tell them thank you when you see them, or really go all out and make a financial contribution to their campaign.

Take it seriously; people have died to give you the right to vote. It is your duty as an American and your responsibility as a Christian. Do it, and do it as an informed voter.
