Cultural Change or the Same Old Sins?

have been walking with the Lord for a long time. During that time. He never ceases to amaze me, even in the smallest things. This issue of the CAM newsletter is a perfect illustration of that fact. The article on rality in America either page one was originally written in 2014 by a man who lamented the fact that things have changed in America's culture in the direction of Christian influence being lessened over several decades. He based his observations to a large degree on our nation's moral decline after the Supreme Court ruled against unborn babies in the infamous Roe v Wade case. His 2014 article had

been written, but then had been saved for later and not published at the time. Before his article surfaced in 2018, I had felt led (I am sure by the Holy Spirit) to write something about the decline of mobecause of Roe v Wade or "gay marriage". I keep both newspaper/magazine and internet articles on file that pertain to issues of interest to the Christian community. I felt led to go through these articles well before I found Darrell's 2014 essay, never published in the CAM newsletter or anywhere else. It struck me as an excellent fit for the points

the Holy Spirit had also lead me to think about. After receiving Darrell's permission to print his article in the CAM newsletter. I discovered three other examples in the files of exactly what he was talking about. All three (two letters to the editor and an editorial) came from a Vermont newspaper almost 20 years ago. They were from three different issues on different days. I thought that our readers would be interested to read what local Vermont citizens were saying about the sanctity of human life in 1999. They are timeless. They could have just as well been written today in 2018. I

would like to discuss the two letters, as they were written by ordinary Vermont citizens.

The first was a letter to the editor from a man named Kevin. He was protesting the politically correct double standard that looked at an unborn baby's life as cheap, while the lives of two cats were considered worthy of protection and citizen outrage. His letter, titled "Value All Life", was as follows:

"Value all life"

"There is an interesting scenario in the Vermont Senate that I would like to

share with the readers of this paper.

"There are some senators who believe in a woman's right to choose an abortion who now support a bill that will dictate what you may or may not print in your will. I find it interesting that a senator or anyone else would support a woman's right to end a child's life. However, if that same ferent matter, was pubwoman wrote in her will that she would like to have her two cats put to sleep (upon her death) that would be illegal.

"This type of thinking is either hypocrisy . . . or these folks are declaring that cats are more valuable than human beings.

"Am I saying that I support the senseless destruction of life? No, but I do know that human life is the most precious and valuable of all life, unborn or those at the end of life."

The gist of the legislation apparently proposed almost 20 years ago in Vermont would have made it illegal for a human to order his/her pets put to sleep upon the death of the owner. Interesting, as the gentleman observed in his letter, that some of the same legislators who objected to

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this also supported a woman's right to abort her human baby. Well said, sir. This is what happens when a culture loses its Judeo-Christian underpinnings and becomes morally relative.

The second letter, from a different individual concerned with an entirely diflished under the title "Politically depersonalized" and read as follows.

"Politically depersonalized"

"Regarding the...story about pregnant women declining to eat possibly mercury-tainted seafood: I find it excruciatingly politically correct that the reporter wrote that one woman had chosen to cut down to only one tuna sandwich a month to protect 'her fetus'. "Even the phrasing is awkward: 'to protect her fetus'. Why not (call it) 'the growth attached to her uterus' or 'the temporary

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There is no doubt our culture has changed, but could the pendulum be swinging back to a more moral base?
