This course is designed to develop competency in the use of the Internet, including critical comparison of web sites, web site development, connectivity, and the use of multimedia programs including Google Sites and Weebly.com. Students research, design and build their own 4-6 page "live" websites. Students create websites using text, images, sound and video files. Students master copyright, fair-use and creative control issues. A detailed understanding of website development from idea to deployment is an integral part of the course.


Academic Honesty:
