

BRIEF SYNOPSIS

LAVINIA WILLIAMS, child of the Harlem Renaissance. She broke the color line to become a classical ballerina; founded a school of dance in Haiti; scandalously married....

LEON THEREMIN, Russian scientist. Inventor of an electronic musical instrument with a spectral sound — the theremin — played without physical contact; ordered back to Stalin's Soviet Union; sent to the gulag.

In the opera *MADAME THEREMIN*, Lavinia discovers a sanctuary of Afro-Carribean culture, hidden underground since colonial times. Here she encounters....

MAMA AUGUSTINE, vodou priestess. Mama guides Lavinia on a spiritual journey through music, dance, and prayer. Lavinia reconnects with her ancestral roots and sets herself on a new path,

but she is still unable to save her husband, a victim of "progress."

Musically, *MADAME THEREMIN* embraces the rich tradition of operatic vocal styles, and makes use of more contemporary timbres found in Black American and Haitian musical traditions. This coupled with the expanded use of the theremin, radios and instruments created for the opera, provides an Afrofuturistic sonic space in which the story will unfold. The story is one that has never been told. Lavinia Williams has always been a footnote in the life of the more famous Leon Theremin. In telling her story we bring something new to the world, in a startling form.

MADAME THEREMIN tells the story of Lavinia Williams' defiance of convention and discovery of her muse and her spiritual roots. Many stories of the Black experience dwell on sadness. This one ends in joy.
