

Bachelor of Health Sciences Program

The program consists of three majors, with Honours option:

- Biomedical Studies
- Community and Population Health
- Environmental Health
- Community and Population Health
- Aboriginal and Rural Health

All majors draw courses from the sciences and social sciences to provide students with a broad understanding of issues while preparing them for further studies in areas as diverse as **medicine, occupational and environmental health, physiotherapy, speech pathology, management and administration, epidemiology, and community health**. It includes courses such as anatomy, physiology, health information management, and occupational health.

The Bachelor of Health Sciences Degree is a four-year program with a range of courses that relate to the science of health, in the recognition that health is a complex entity defying a simple explanation or a single disciplinary perspective. The courses within the Program offer learning opportunities from a variety of disciplines, such as Life Sciences, Social Sciences, and Behavioral Sciences, in order to enable students to develop an understanding relating to all dimensions of Health.

Studying with researchers in these diverse health disciplines allows students access to ideas and techniques that will be eventually incorporated into best practices. It is very exciting to be a part of a team that influences how the health sciences are applied, from research, to clinical practice to the community level. Our degree has all the prerequisite courses for PT and OT, medical, dentistry and optometry.
