DIGI - YARNS

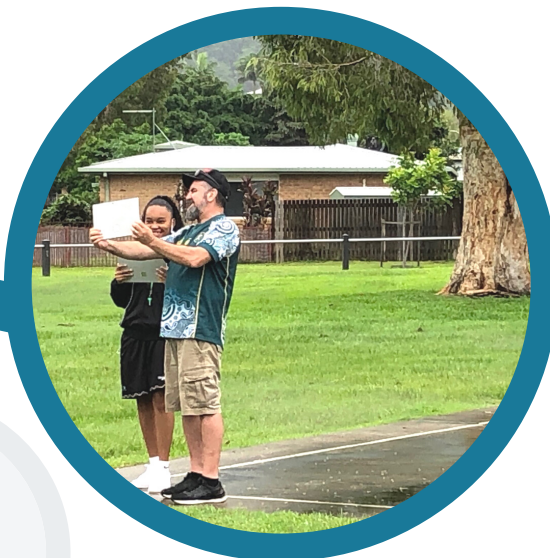
The Deadly Digi Yarns: Cairns West Way project was delivered in partnership with the Queensland Family & Child Commission (QFCC). Young people aged 12-18 worked alongside community Elders in this digital story-telling project, receiving some invaluable cultural mentoring. Over five (5) days, participants developed their story ideas, learned how to create a strong storyline and practiced filming techniques. They then went to various locations in Cairns West to film parts of their story and conduct interviews. Afterwards they spent time producing and editing their short films using video editing software. On the final day, a 'film festival' was held (complete with popcorn for everyone), where the films created by the young people were showcased to family and community members.
