SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAM

374 engagements were recorded in the three week SPAYC January School Holiday Program. 41 activities were provided (approximately 13 per week) and were available across 7 locations.

Options available included Youth Gym, Hip Hop/Afro Dance, Soccer, Basketball, Volleyball, AFL, and Hula Hoops.

ANIMAL MANAGEMENT

In August 2019, 86 households agreed to participate in a trial informing best practice in animal management in low socio-economic areas, with focus specifically on canine management during the trial period. In February, CSS and Council will visit all trial participants again to determine their adherence to the protocols and manage any changes in household animal composition.





SPAYC+PLACE INDUCTION SESSION

The January SPAYC+PLACE Service Providers Induction was a great opportunity to catch up with our existing facilitators and also to meet our new SPAYC Service Providers.

This session was also a wonderful opportunity for everyone to meet to our newest Partners who have recently come on board with the program. The session was attended by 16 Partners and 13 new Service Providers and facilitators.
