Mental ill health costs Australian workplaces

- Only 22% of workers with common signs and symptoms get the help they require

After training Mental Health First Aid Officers can then be appointed and supported to provide mental health first aid within their worksite. They can also be accredited after a simple online test *accreditation lasts 3 years
