These officers assist young people to navigate a range of post-school study, training and work options in line with their individual goals, aspirations, skills and strengths and support them to make independent choices that will equip them to make a successful transition.

- Skilling Queenslanders for Work
- Back to Work employer subsidies
- Alternative entry to university
- Employment
- Alternative entry to TAFE
- JobActive and other federal workforce participation programs (e.g. Empowering YOUth).


