



 - We have achieved growth but not at the level we projected.




Full-time Enrollment

Accreditation Summary

Major Commendations

The Site Visit Team found much for which Ascension Academy is to be commended. While the commendations are detailed throughout the report, some important themes are listed below.

- 1. Ascension Academy does a tremendous job of communicating the faith statement and mission statement in all methods of communication. It is highlighted as the lead in all communication.(1.1.5)
- 2. The parents, staff, and faculty are clearly committed to the faith statement and bring it into all activities. They express a commitment to the school and its continued growth. (1.1.5, 4.1.1)
- 3. A biblical perspective is interwoven into the curriculum and is faithfully taught. (2.1.2)
- 4. The school is blessed with an exceptionally talented and faithful administrator. She works tirelessly for the benefit of the school and its students. All stakeholders indicate that they have a high level of trust with the school administrator. (1.3.2, 4.3.1)
- 5. The governing body is very committed to the school, understands its roles, and is committed to moving forward in a strategic way. (4.3.1)
- 6. Parents are very satisfied with the education that is happening at the school. (3.1.2)
- 7. Teachers appreciate the level of autonomy that they receive as well as the support provided. (3.1.1)
- 8. Ascension Academy is blessed with a team of committed, talented, inspired, and faithful teachers. They genuinely care about their students and want what's best for them. Students are blessed to be under their instruction and care. (2.2.2)




Academic Excellence


We strive for academic excellence in all that we do at Ascension Academy. This priority is seen in our teaching staff as well as the curriculum that we have chosen. Below is a representation of academic growth from Ascension Academy's Wisconsin Forward test results. For English Language Arts, 29% of our students were meeting the Wisconsin Standards in 2023 and 84% were meeting or exceeding these standards in 2024. For math, 29% of our students were meeting the Wisconsin Standards in 2023 and 84% were meeting or exceeding these standards in 2023 and 84% were meeting or exceeding these standards in 2023, for both English Language Arts and math, 71% of our students were either developing or approaching (not meeting) the Wisconsin Standards. This decreased to only 16% of our students in 2024.

Spiritual Growth

- Our students attend weekly chapels. Area pastors and Christian leaders come and speak at our chapels. A summary of the chapel message is described in our weekly newsletter.
- Students have Bible class daily, working through the New Testament this year. Students that have been here since our first year will have read through the entire Bible by the end of this school year. In addition, students memorize key verses weekly.
- All subject matter is taught from a biblical worldview.
- All our students have pen pals at Unity in Hope School System in Pakistan. We pray for these students.
- Our students participated with Operation Christmas Child by packing numerous boxes for children in need. They were told that each box would include the message of Jesus and the Gospel in the recipient's native language.



- Our theme verse this year, Colossians 3:17, reminds us of our purpose: "And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." We strive to honor Christ in all we do academically, spiritually, and relationally.
- Student discipline involves looking at God's Word and praying together. We get to the root of the behavior in an age-appropriate manner using God's Word as the basis for correction. The fruit of the Spirit is often mentioned. Galatians 5:22-23, " But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law."








Ascension Academy's vision is definitely Christian.










